A recent front-page article in the Chicago Tribune focused on end-of-life issues. The reporter, who followed the final days in the life of a man in his early eighties, recorded the last conversations the man shared with his wife. He told his wife that, since he could no longer help people, he was ready to go home to God. In his final days he defined the meaning of his existence: to help people. The sentiments of this dying man are echoed in today's second reading, which is a kind of last will and testament for Saint Paul, who knows that his departure is at hand. The original text employs an unusual word that has been translated "departure." One of that original word's meanings is the image of a wandering nomad folding up his tent. How fitting a description for Saint Paul's life, a life spent on the move, spreading the Good News of the Lord Jesus.

OUR OWN DEPARTURE

Do you ever wonder what your final sentiments will be before you depart this earth? Saint Paul's words are inspiring for those on the Christian journey. He longs for that day when the crown of righteousness awaits him. Saint Paul tells us that that crown is waiting not only for him—it awaits "all who have longed for [the Lord's] appearance" (2 Timothy 4:8). We may not have had the kind of life that Saint Paul had, but each of us, in our own way, has longed for the appearance of the Lord Jesus. Let us pray for the strength to finish the race as Saint Paul did, with strong faith. When the time comes for us to fold up our tents, may we look back on a life spent helping others. May we be welcomed into heaven and receive the crown of righteousness.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend Ed Moise, the chair of our parish finance committee, will briefly speak at all Masses about the financial status of our parish. This will be the first time since I've been here that the finance committee has done this and I am very happy to have them do so.

Perceptions are important because they often drive what we think, and importantly, what we do. When you look at our parish there are a number of perceptions. Some of them are correct; some are probably not fully developed. But each is important for what it causes us to do.

The main perception I would like to clarify is that this is not MY parish but OUR parish. You will remember my saying this in my recent "state of the parish" address. This is important to remember because while as pastor I am charged with overseeing our physical assets, they are not my assets...they are yours and ours!

The purpose of the Finance Committee, consisting of members who are parish members, underscores this reality. When this committee gathers once a month it is your representatives looking at all facets of our physical reality. While they do not have decision making authority, as pastor I seriously consider every one of their recommendations and almost without exception follow through on their advice. Not only do they have the financial expertise needed, but they are aware of how our parish reality is perceived as one "sitting in the pews."

Like any parish our physical realty impacts our financial reality. We have no control, except possibly by exercising preventative maintenance, to what will happen with our buildings. To some extent we do have control on how we will remedy the needs by contributing money so repairs can be made. The recent emergency sacristy floor repair is an example. This repair was not expected and could not be delayed. Where does one get the money to make the repair? There is no money in our operating budget to cover such emergencies. Fortunately we have the church restoration fund. While we have earmarked the money in this fund towards the restoration of our church tower, the fund is for general restoration which this certainly fit under.

Obviously the bottom line is that this is YOUR/OUR parish and it will ultimately be you who determines what we can or cannot do. I want to thank many of you who have shown such great generosity, some who are in very challenging circumstances. I encourage all of us to consider anew how we can support our parish in its many needs; physical, personnel, and programming. Thanks to all.
