

December 8, 2013 • Second Sunday of Advent

On this Second Sunday of Advent we hear Isaiah predicting the coming of the Messiah and the messianic age. He foretells that "a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse" and blossom into "a signal for the nations" of the justice and peace that the Messiah brings (Isaiah 11:1, 10). This scripture is the source of the O Antiphon that invokes the Flower of Jesse's stem, raised up as a sign for all peoples.

Jesus is that shoot from the stump of Jesse and sign of God's love. Paul's letter to the Romans echoes Isaiah's words, reminding us that Jesus Christ came for *all* people—as a sign of God's faithfulness to the promises to the Jewish people, as well as God's mercy to the Gentiles. John the Baptist announced that the time of waiting was over when he said, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Matthew 3:1).

"THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN IS AT HAND!"

How are we to respond when we hear that "the kingdom of heaven is at hand"? John's words, together with today's other readings, can be a source of real hope in our lives. They invite us to relinquish any lingering fears about our unworthiness and accept the reality of God's limitless love for us. They challenge us to repent of our pride and prejudice, and open our hearts to those who are different from us. They encourage us not to despair over the suffering in our world, but to take action to foster God's justice and peace. The period of waiting for a Messiah is over. Jesus is among us here and now, sharing with us his spirit of hope, courage, and love. Now is the time for us to blossom and produce the good fruits of the messianic age.

Let us pray: O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples . . . Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid (Evening Prayer, December 19).

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parish Family,

It's that time of year when family and friends begin to ask us what we want for Christmas. Often our response is, "you really don't have to get me anything." It's probably true, most of us have what we need and if we don't have it, we ordinarily get it without waiting for someone to gift us with it for Christmas. Most gifts are temporary at best...even in the best of circumstances we eventually grow out of the shirt, we finish eating the perennial fruitcake (yes, it has been known to happen!), we use up the stationary.

But what about a gift that will last many years, probably over a hundred years? Now that might be worth considering! This Christmas you have that opportunity to suggest such a gift for you or you can gift another with this gift. What might this be? A donation in the name of another to the restoration of our St. Mary's Bell Tower!

What is the status of the tower restoration? At this writing we are close to having \$750,000 towards a \$950,000 project. With the promise of state tax credits AFTER the project is finished and paid for, we have the potential of receiving up to almost \$200,000 more. Therefore we are closing the gap. But we're not quite there yet. But 2014 is the year this project will get done!

At the end of this calendar year the Finance Committee will look at the potential gap between what we have and what we need and determine how to finance the gap. A loan? We haven't crossed that bridge yet but obviously the more we have at the end of this year the less we have to bridge.

There were two church related expenses that recently occurred which had to be taken care of and made a dent in our restoration fund. We had the replace the sacristy floor because of the deterioration of the joists underneath and we were able to finally re-plaster and paint the back wall which had been problematic for over the last two years. These projects cost a total \$45,000. So if they hadn't occurred, we would be even \$45,000 closer to our goal. But these things happen.

If you would like to give or receive a Christmas gift which indicates a contribution toward the tower has been made, we are ready for you. Just send the name(s) to be honored, addresses, and a contribution toward the tower project and we'll take care of the rest.

Not only will we acknowledge the gift in time for Christmas but the individuals so honored will be perpetually remembered in the appropriate donor gift category on our memory board to be unveiled when the project is complete.

Maybe, as the song goes, "all (I) you want for Christmas is (my) your two front teeth." But for others this Christmas you may want to give or receive something that connects with the eternal. Think about it. You won't even need to worry about gift wrapping!

St. Alphonsus Parish/St. Mary's Assumption Church Human Concerns Committee 2013 End-of-Year Report

Dear fellow parishioners,

We are pleased to provide you with an overview of your Human Concerns Committee's (HCC) activities in 2013.

1. Thanks to your generous support we conducted a monthly food drive. The service project provided non-perishable food to the needy of our parish and the clients of Hope House. In one representative period, July-October, you contributed 2,094 items and \$90.00 in cash.

2. As most of you are aware, New Orleans Catholic Workers provide an outreach dinner to those in need at Hope House every Tuesday and Thursday. This October the committee endorsed and started a second monthly service project. In this effort, committee members and other parishioners supplement Catholic Workers at their dinner for those in need on the third Thursday night of each month. We have helped serve nutritious meals to more than 30 individuals at each event.

3. Responding to an opportunity to support the Archdiocesan ACCESS Pregnancy and Referral Center ministry, the committee received \$966.00 in donations from caring parishioners during this Spring's "Baby Bottle Drive".

4. The committee was the forum through which several quality of life issues impacting our parishioners and neighbors in the River Garden area were conveyed to the highest levels of HRI Properties.

5. This Fall the HCC responded to a second call for service from the Archdiocese. Two committee members served as conveners for the Racial Harmony Workshops hosted at our parish throughout October.

6. Also this Fall the committee met a requirement from St. Alphonsus School, helping to identify prospective tutors to support after school enrichment and study programs for students.
