

## December 29, 2013 • The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

In our day and age it is not easy to maintain healthy family relationships. Our culture often works against us. The Christmas season, especially, magnifies the differences between the values that we Catholic Christians hold and the values of the ordinary world. Christmas can also exacerbate tensions within our families. Sometimes we may want to run away and hide!

The feast of the Holy Family gives us much-needed encouragement. The readings from Sirach and Colossians show us the holy significance of the day-to-day decisions and behavior in our everyday family lives. The Gospel story shows Joseph following divine guidance as he responded to different challenges—first fleeing to Egypt to keep Jesus safe, and then moving to Nazareth in Galilee to raise Jesus in the midst of the Jewish faith and culture. How can we follow Joseph's lead and let God guide our families in holiness?

## "PUT ON LOVE"

Paul's letter to the Colossians provides us with a key insight. The end of today's selection contains some advice

from the "household codes" of the pagan philosophers of Paul's day, but this advice is not the focus of Paul's words. Paul's main focus is on our baptism into Christ, when each of us "put on love" (Colossians 3:14). The divine love that was made flesh in Jesus and fills each of us in baptism is so all-embracing that it can transform every aspect of our lives—from the most mundane family relationships to our most spiritual relationship with God—into something holy in God's eyes.

This feast reminds us that in Christ, the divine and the human, the ordinary and the holy, were forever linked. When we "put on" the divine love that was poured out on us in baptism, we will nurture holiness in all our relationships—in our families, faith communities, and the wider human family.


