God bless you as we come to the close of another Christmas season! This weekend, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus entered the waters of the Jordan to go ahead of us and make water as the matter for our baptisms as He instituted baptism as the "gateway" sacrament. By baptism we went from "children of wrath" to "children of righteousness"--adopted children of God by the gift of Sanctifying Grace which Christ merited for us by all His saving work. Reflect on all that we received at our baptism: Sanctifying Grace and the supernatural change in status as mentioned above. Along with Sanctifying Grace, came supernatural Faith, Hope & Love and all the gifts of the Holy Spirit (Wisdom, Knowledge, Counsel, Piety, Understanding, Filial fear & Fortitude) and the fruits of the Holy Spirit (Charity, Joy, Faithfulness, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Patience, Peace, Self-Control, Modesty & Chastity). Because we've been blessed to be baptized ourselves and live in a society where most are baptized, we have to avoid taking that for granted. Of course, sadly, many who are baptized do not live according to their baptismal commitment to God and squander all the supernatural gifts they have received. Nonetheless, history bears out that there is an incredible difference between a society that has a majority of its citizens who consider their Christian commitment important versus societies that are non-Christian. I point to the past of the brutality of pagans/barbarians prior to being evangelized whether in the Americas, Africa, Asia or Europe. Even the pagan Roman empire was brutal to its non-citizens and held things together by the power of its military force among its citizenry. Furthermore, I point to the past and present brutality and oppressiveness of the Muslims following their Koran and Sharia "Law". And when we saw all the brutality and violence that took place in the 20th century, was not most it committed by those who closed their hearts to Christ and instead chose the darkness of pagan Nazism and atheistic Communism. There are consequences to what people believe and they can be very dire, especially when those with the military and political power have enough leverage to do their terrible damage. Look to the Catholic Saints to see shining examples of those who lived for Christ and manifested the Kingdom of God in our midst. Despite nearly two thousand years of very difficult challenges including attacks and persecutions, the Catholic Church still continues in her God-given mission. This can only happen with the whole array of graces, blessings, spiritual gifts with which she has been endowed by God, first through Baptism.

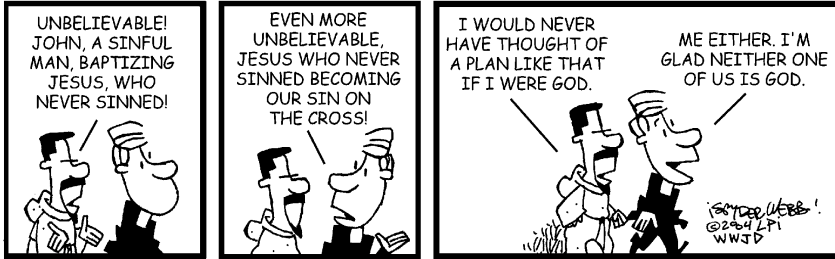

The Maker's Recall Notice
