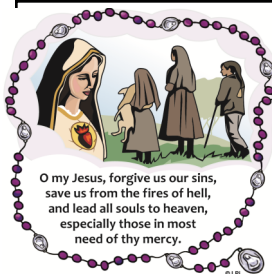

Greetings in Christ! Thank you to all who will be helping to put on and donating to the seminarian benefit lunch this Sunday at Sacred Heart parish hall after the 10am Mass. God bless you for your prayerful support of priestly vocations in our Diocese!

Our first reading and the Gospel this weekend remind us of the power of God's word that we receive in Sacred Scripture. Hopefully, we are all devoted to regular reading and reflection on Sacred Scripture and thereby draw ever closer in our personal relationship with God.

Thank you to Fr. Thury for his coverage while I am away visiting my parents. During the season of Lent through Holy Week, Fr. Thury will be giving coverage to three parishes in West River: Presho, Murdo and Draper. He'll be a long commuter, so as to return to Dimock during the weekdays!

Some future projects for each of the parishes discussed at our recent parish finance councils:

At Ss. Peter and Paul parish, we hope to have in place by springtime, a new "wrap-around" chair lift in the west entryway that will not only go up the stairs to the church, but also down to the restroom area in the basement. (Subject to the approval of the Bishop)

At Sacred Heart parish, (hopefully by spring/summer of 2017), we plan to add six stained glass windows each with some art pertaining to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As well as adding to the sacred environment of the church, it also adds some very practical advantages: more light and with "hopper" windows to allow in fresh air on occasion. We are in the early stages of communication with stained glass companies and also locally with MidContinent. (Subject to the approval of the Bishop)

Also, this spring, the six large colored glass panels in the main entryway of Sacred Heart church are going to receive some maintenance work and have an 1/4" acrylic panel placed over them. The material that is holding the pieces of glass together is deteriorating and so help is needed to upgrade the situation. It will be a little over \$9,000 for the labor and materials on that project.

None of the above projects will entail special fundraising, but if anyone would like to make a special contribution toward any of the projects once underway, you are more than welcome to make such an offering!

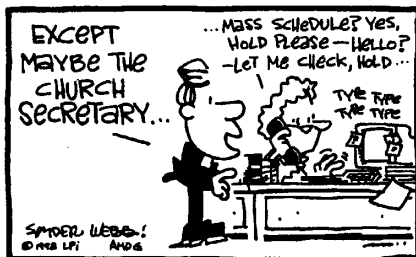
