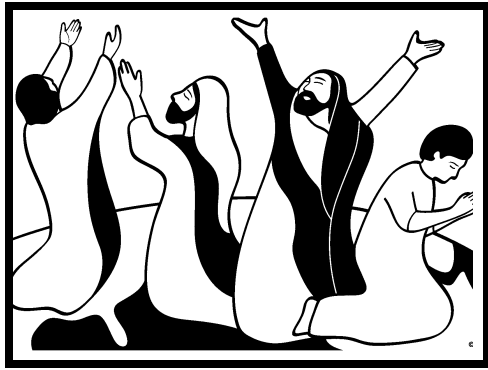

Greetings in Christ! Praise the Lord for such an abundant harvest and beautiful harvest season! This weekend we especially think about the great "harvest of souls" we are all to be involved in as we worship God and give Him thanks for the many holy heroes of the Faith with "All Saints Day". On Monday, Nov. 2nd, we have "All Souls Day". We will have Masses for "All Souls Day": 8:30am at Sacred Heart parish and 8:30am at Ss. Peter & Paul parish (which Fr. Thury will offer).

It is a good and holy action to pray for our beloved deceased.

Here's a quote from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, 1 Cor 3: 11-15

"No one can lay a foundation other than the one that has been laid, namely Jesus Christ. If different ones build on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay or straw, the work of each will be made clear. The Day will disclose it. That day will make its appearance with fire, and fire will test the quality of each man's work. If the building a man has raised on this foundation still stands, he will receive his recompense; if a man's building burns, he will suffer loss. He himself will be saved, but only as one fleeing through fire."

Commentary: Clearly, St. Paul is inspired to write that there will be a "day" of reckoning in which we each will have to give an account as to our work and the type of "building" we have constructed (our lives). The fire that St. Paul speaks of can't be referring to those already in heaven as there will be no need of any purifying fire there. His teaching "[I]f a man's building burns, he will suffer loss. He himself will be saved, but only as one fleeing through fire" can't be referring to souls in hell as they can no longer be saved. This then leaves reference to the souls in purgatory who will eventually reach heaven, "but only as one fleeing through fire".

All Souls Day Masses:

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. A reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin."

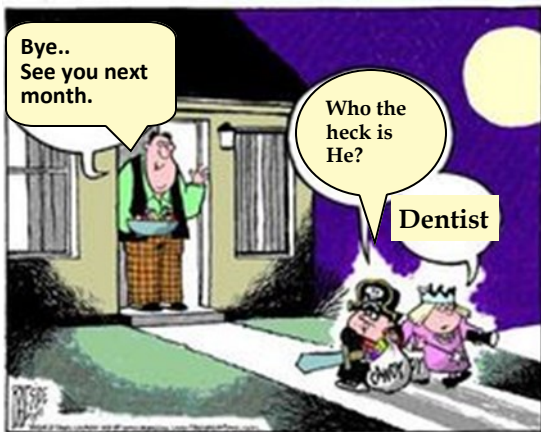
