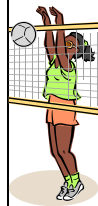

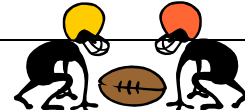
The cribs will be put up after Thanksgiving.

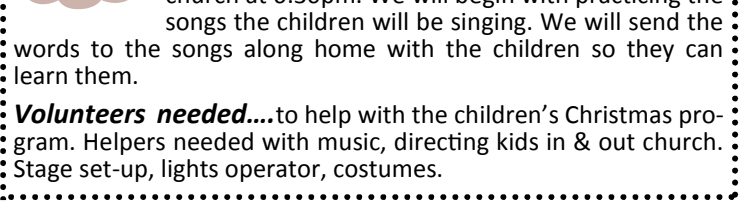
Thank you to everyone for volunteering for the various ministries serving the Lord.

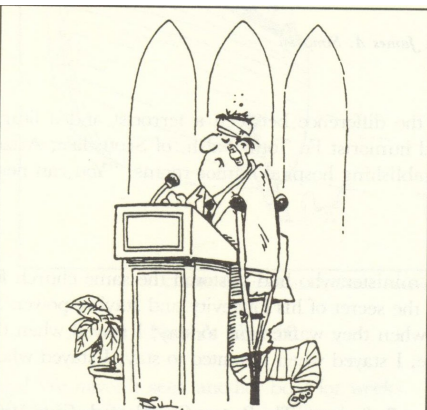
