Greetings in Christ! Many are aware that 2017 will be the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima to the three Portuguese shepherd children: Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta. Far fewer persons are aware that starting in the spring of 1916, on several occasions, God sent an angel to help prepare the children for what would happen in the next year by teaching them about doing penance, prayer including Eucharistic adoration. They were taught to make sacrifices and offer them up for the conversion of poor sinners. We should do the same during Lent and throughout the year. Here are the three prayers the angel of Fatima taught Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You. I beg pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope, and do not love You. (repeat three times in honor of the Most Holy Trinity)

O Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly. I offer You the most Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the Tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg the conversion of poor sinners. (repeat three times)

O Most Holy Trinity, I adore You! My God, my God, I love You in the Most Blessed Sacrament! (repeat three times)

If you know world history, then you will know what dire straights the world was in during this time: the horrors of World War I and the stage being set for the downfall of the Czar in Russia and the coming of the Communist Revolution headed by Lenin. If you do not know much about the messages of Our Lady of Fatima, I highly encourage you to research and learn. It is all very much pertinent for our own time.




