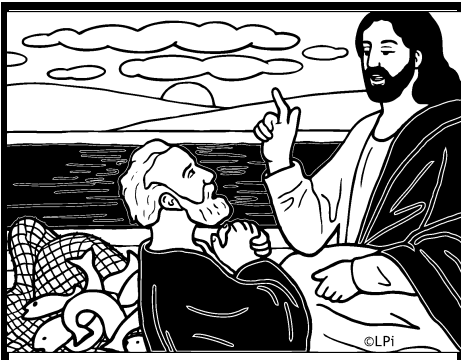

Precepts on fasting and abstaining from meat during Lent:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until the age of 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. On that same day, two smaller meals may also be taken, but not equal to a full meal. There should be no snacking between meals on a fast day. One may drink liquids between meals. The norms for abstaining from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

This is an interesting additional note that I read on the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

The fast on Good Friday, if possible (I interpret that as NOT mandatory), is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

### Lenten Regulations for Catholics

The Christian faithful are to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by works of piety and charity. All Fridays through the year, especially during Lent, are penitential days.

...Abstinence: All who have reached their 14<sup>th</sup>. birthday are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

...Fasting: All who are 18 or older, until their 59<sup>th</sup>. birthday are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is allowed on days of fast. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's need; but together, they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be affected seriously. People in doubt about fast or abstinence should consult a priest.

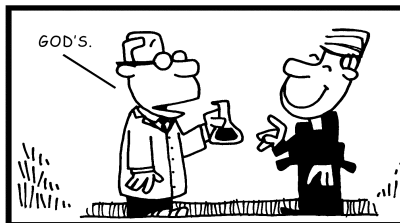
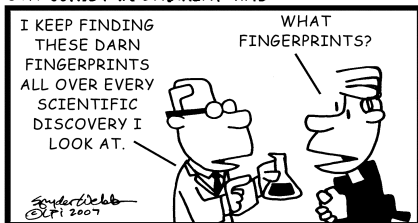
