

Update for office help for Sacred Heart parish: I do have someone who is to be hired and will be in the office Mondays, Tuesdays and in the morning hours of Wednesday and a few extra hours weekly at home or in the church or outside on parish grounds. Besides shared office duties, this person will do bookkeeping/payroll/preparing bill payments etc., producing the bulletin and monthly calendar, church decoration throughout the year (with some assistance from volunteers), plus planting and watering and weeding on parish grounds.

We are in need of hiring another person to share (non-bookkeeping) office duties, Sacred Heart DRE/CYO/Totus Tuus/Safe Environment Coordinator, coordination of Sacred Heart parish ministry schedule for the monthly calendar and weekly bulletin, helping to prepare for various parish social events of Sacred Heart parish among other tasks to be discussed with Father and other directives given by Father from time to time. This position would also maintain record of parish hall rentals/reservations and the Mass intention schedules for both Sacred Heart and Saints Peter & Paul parishes. This position requires a working knowledge of computer and other typical office machines. On occasion, this position will need to produce a weekly bulletin and often be the one to run the bulletin off on the copier. When interviewing with Father for this paid position, duties can be discussed in more detail.

This position would entail being in the office on Wednesdays from 1pm to 4:30pm, plus Wednesday evenings during CCD nights from about 6:45pm to 8:30pm, Thursdays from 9am to noon and 1pm to 4:30pm and on Fridays from 9am to noon and 1pm to 4:30pm. There can be some flexibility if there are some Friday afternoons in which one needs to leave earlier, provided discussed ahead of time with Father. This position would be for about 19 to 20 hours per week, typically. I hope to fill this position soon and begin to allow for paid hours of on-the-job training in May & June under JoAnn before she retires. If you would interested in this job please contact Fr. 
