

Health update: Friday, April 22nd, I checked into the hospital at Parkston. I had a CTscan done. It showed that in my lower left quadrant I have "epiploic appendagitis" (basically chronic inflammation

of appendages connected to the lower colon). It was quite painful, but not nearly as bad now. There isn't much that can be done other than wait for the inflammation to hopefully go away on it's own (typically 3 to 14 days) and have the assistance of some pain medication. I keep the chancellor and bishop updated on my health issues too. Thanks for your prayers!


