May the souls of all who fell in battle for our nation rest in peace! Have a grace filled Memorial Day.

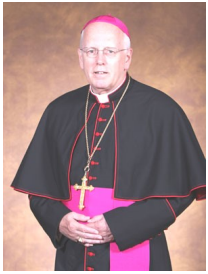

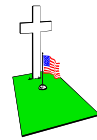

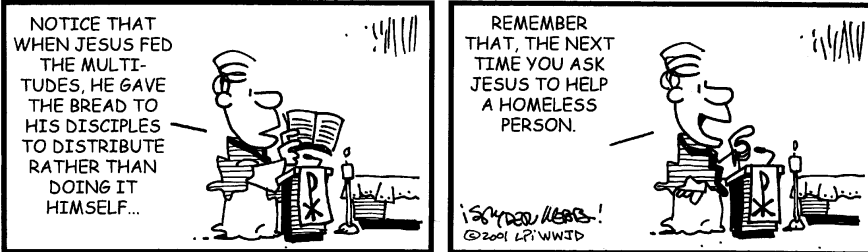

The holiday known as Memorial Day was actually conceived three years after the end of the Civil War. In 1868, the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans, established Decoration Day as a national day to place flowers on the graves of those who died in battle. Confederate groups acknowledged their war heroes in a similar way but founded their traditions on a different day. By the 20th century, the two sides merged their observances to recognize all Americans who had died while in military service.

Memorial Day became an official federal holiday celebrated on the last Monday in May in 1971.
