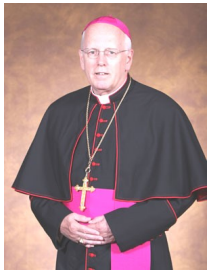

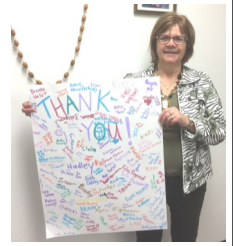
JoAnn is retiring!

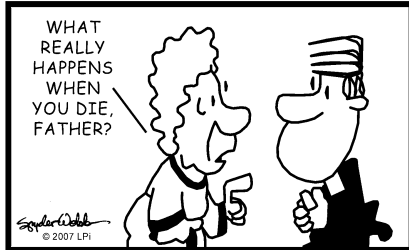
