Purchasers must provide their own transport of pews bought.

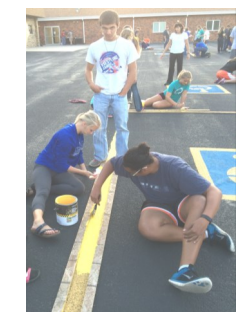

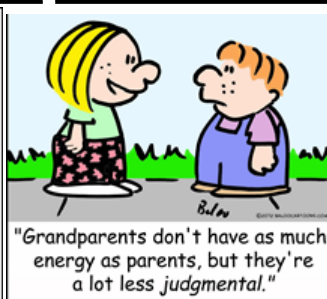
