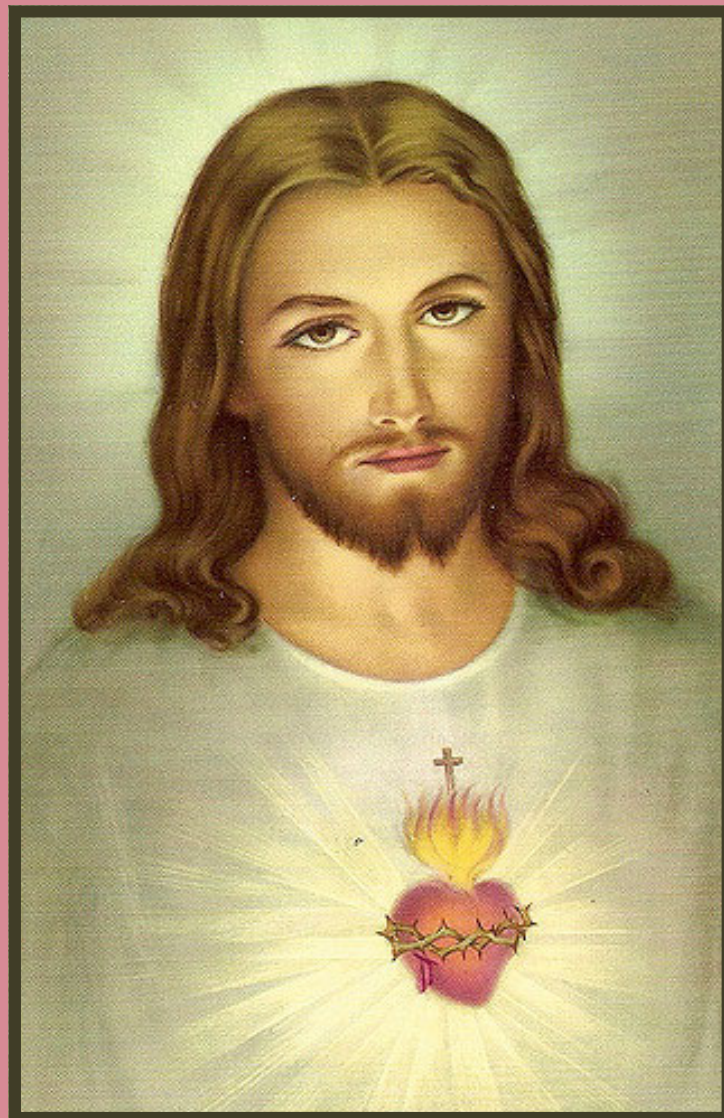

**Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time,
Year A,
July 23, 2017**

In today's Gospel from Matthew, we hear the parable of the sowing of good seed in the field and the sowing of bad seed (evil) by the devil. Until the end of time there will be the struggle of good vs. evil. The problem we often encounter is the proper recognition of evil. Evil can masquerade as good. At the surface level, many things sound good. But even though something may sound good, it may not be. So, how can we tell the difference?

Theology is the study of the nature of God and of religious belief. Faith and reason bring us to the realization of God and the purpose of life. Pope John Paul II in his Encyclical (a teaching document) *Fides et Ratio* published in 1998 states, "Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves."

God has given man the gifts needed to fight evil. He has given man reason. There is an old saying, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!" Even a pious act can look good; but when done for the wrong reason it can create harm. If we look closely at anything, we can tell the difference between what is good and fruitful and what is bad and harmful. If it is not fruitful, we should avoid it.

In the same encyclical, St. John Paul II writes, "Man's intellectual capacity, his ability to reason and to think in abstract terms, is a great gift. Man can acquire true knowledge about himself, God, and the world. Man is born with a desire to know the truth about himself. It is essential that he find the truth because only by choosing

true values by which to live can he be true to his nature and find happiness."

Aren't we all trying to find true happiness? The pursuit of happiness extends from man to the supportive institutions of man: the family, businesses, organizations, and even our local church. Are we doing those things that give us true happiness in our personal and institutional actions? If we are, we are on the way to a successful existence. If we are not, perhaps we should rethink our priorities in life. In all that we do, we should glorify God and give support and encouragement to others. We should do this "where the rubber meets the road," existentially within our families, our work places, our associations—both casual and formal—and especially within our church community.

God sows the seed. He has given us the garden. Within the garden is the soil to be tilled and ourselves as the plants to be nourished and pruned. In the end our souls will be collected. May we use our faith and reason to become those plants collected by the angels and placed within the harvest of God.

May we take the love of God from this place to the world.

Treasures from Our Tradition

For centuries, the only Eucharistic Prayer we heard as Western Catholics was the old Roman Canon, usually recited in a low voice by the priest, in Latin. By the 1940s, many Catholics were learning to follow along with the actions of the priest by means of a bilingual missal, with Latin on one side and English on the other. Drawings of the priest's position at the altar, moving from one side to the other, or bowing or standing with uplifted hands at the center, helped the readers stay on track.

The Roman Canon is a long prayer, and since it was done every day for every occasion, priests had a way of galloping through it. Even though long, its structure is fairly simple, with the consecration and sacrifice clearly marked out. Sadly, this surviving prayer had triumphed over many treasures of our tradition that emphasized other dimensions of Eucharist. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy in 1963 did not call directly for new Eucharistic Prayers, but that direction was inevitable. Discussion began almost immediately, and by 1967 the Vatican approved three new Eucharistic Prayers. In 1974, the Congregation for Worship unveiled the experiment of two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation, and three for Masses with Children. At last, a period of creativity and enrichment had begun.

SUMMARY

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Prepares, administers and reviews compliance with the budget for revenue and expenses in collaboration with Pastor and Finance Council;
2. Advises the Pastor regarding the application of financial policies;
3. Facilitates the achievement of revenue targets, including offertory, Bishop's appeals, special collections, planned giving, and other fundraising activities;
4. Monitors the collection, counting, depositing, and recording of revenue from all sources;
5. Ensures that proper internal controls pertaining to the safeguarding of assets are in place and followed;
6. Maintains an accurate filing and record keeping and reporting system of parish financial matters;
7. Ensures that timely reconciliation of all accounts is performed;
8. Oversees processing of payroll for compliance with Archdiocesan policies and with federal and state regulations;
9. Oversees the Bookkeeper who prepares monthly, quarterly, and year-end financial reports for the Pastor and the necessary Archdiocesan Finance Offices;
10. Facilitates reporting to the parishioners regarding the use of their gifts of time, talent, and treasure;
11. Assists the Pastor in financial stewardship and long-range planning efforts;
12. Serves as a resource to the Pastor in all financial matters from planning to auditing;
13. Directs the operation of the business office;
14. Schedules, supervises, and provides staff support and management;
15. Oversees operation of computer system, telephone system, and other equipment;
16. Attends Pastor-approved Archdiocesan meetings for training and development.

SPECIFIC KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED

1. Knowledge of accounting principles and best practices;
2. Knowledge of and commitment to stewardship;
3. Knowledge of cash flow management;
4. Knowledge and ability in budgeting principles;

11. Strong interpersonal and organizational skills;

- Supervise bookkeeper and other office support staff as directed by Pastor.
- Supervises the maintenance staff and manages major repairs or new construction.
- Negotiates contracts with suppliers and construction firms.
- Plans for and takes care of the parish's maintenance needs.
- Prepares, administers, and communicates the parish's security policy and disaster preparedness plan.

Sacred Heart Church in Richmond, TX is in the stage of revamping the Music and Liturgical ministry. We are seeking a well-trained choral director that can recruit new talents, increase our repertoire and bring us to the next level.

The Director of Music Ministry at Sacred Heart Church is responsible for planning, directing, and implementing music for all liturgical and Eucharistic celebrations within the parish.

The Director of Music Ministry reports to both the Parish Administrator and the Pastor.

THE GOALS FOR SACRED HEART'S MUSIC MINISTRY

- To foster “*full, active, and conscious participation*” of the community during the Eucharist by means of careful planning, repeated use of known repertoire, diligent rehearsal and preparation by the musicians, and transparent execution by the music ministry during the liturgy.
- To enhance liturgical prayer by providing quality, well-prepared music including traditional hymns, contemporary songs, Latin repertoire, choral and instrumental selections that match the scriptures of the day, thereby leading the assembly deeper into prayer.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Sunday Liturgies

- Plan all liturgies attentive to the needs of each season
- Attend Liturgy Committee meetings, staff meetings
- Prepare necessary music for rehearsals
- Coordinate volunteers, create calendars
- Schedule accompanists and cantors
- Rehearse adult and teen choirs weekly and additional choirs seasonally
- Prepare director, cantor, and accompanist books weekly
- Collaborate with Pastor, Director of Liturgy, and Director of Youth Ministry for a comprehensive plan for engaging youth at Sunday Eucharist.

Seasonal liturgies

- Plan seasonal liturgies of Advent, Christmas, Christmas Season, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and Easter Season
- Plan and prepare music for Holy Days and Feasts
- Plan Sacramental liturgies, Confirmation, First Eucharist, Penance services, and liturgies for Anointing of the Sick
- Recruit orchestra, prepare books for orchestra for Christmas, Easter, and other special liturgies

Non-Liturgical

- Facilitate Seasonal and Multicultural Concerts

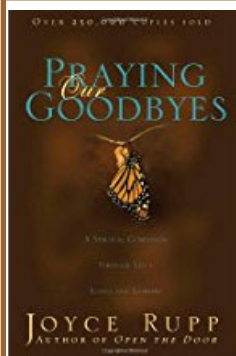


