**Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time,
Year A,
July 30, 2017**

In Disney's *The Jungle Book* (both the cartoon and cg-live action), there is a song that Baloo the bear sings called "The Bare (Bear) Necessities."

The refrain is as follows:

Look for the bare necessities
The simple bare necessities
Forget about your worries and your strife
I mean the bare necessities
Old Mother Nature's recipes
That bring the bare necessities of life

We can learn a thing or two from Baloo. There are many things we can search for, many things that we can set our eyes on. But the most important things that will bring us happiness and true joy are the bare necessities which ultimately come from God. But let us make a distinction.

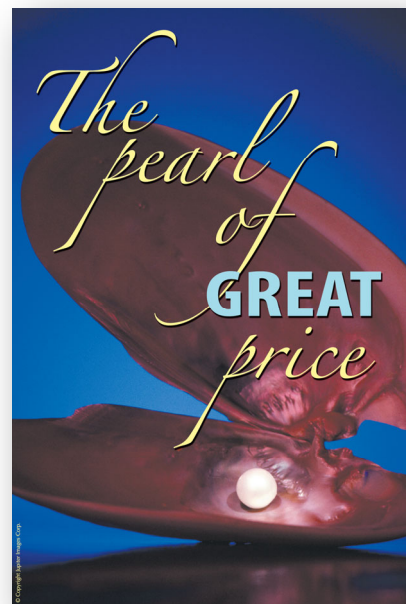
The bare necessities that pertain to the Kingdom of God are not merely a minimalist joy of a life in which we are carefree. The message of the Gospel is not to be like Baloo—to enjoy life through relaxation—but to actively search for the Kingdom, which is worth more than anything this world has to offer. The bare necessities of the Kingdom are far superior to the satisfaction one can find in this world. In essence, "the bare necessities of life" can, for our purposes, be understood as "the most essential necessities of life."

Solomon is a great example of what it means to search for the bare necessities of life. When God appeared to him in a dream, as we hear in the first reading today, He asked Solomon what he desired. Solomon answered, "Give your servant ... an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong. For who is able to govern this vast people of yours?" (1 Kings 3:9). God was pleased with this answer. He could see that Solomon was already wise in his youth because he saw what was most important in his role as a king. Solomon wished only for wisdom; he desired not a long life, riches, or the lives of his enemies. He wished this because he realized that the kingdom that was given to him was not his own; it was God's. And so God granted his wish, and in addition gave him all the other things that he did not wish for.

The Gospel today also shows what it means to seek the bare necessities in life, although once again, this bare necessity is not about being a minimalist, but about gaining something of such high value that nothing else can compare. In today's Gospel we hear two parables about how a man finds something very valuable (a treasure, a precious pearl) and sells all that he has to obtain it. Like Solomon, they portray a sense of wisdom because they distinguished what was more important, what was of higher value. They realized that the treasure they found, the pearl that they stumbled across, was worth more than everything they owned. They would be even richer than they already were, and were willing to give away everything they already had in a heartbeat since the thing they would receive would satisfy them even more.

In both the first reading and the Gospel, God is calling us to have the Spirit of Wisdom: to distinguish between the essentials and non-essentials. Wisdom is the first of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit because the desire for the essentials of God is the first step in helping us to obtain them. By knowing what is truly important, we will be able to see why so many people were willing to give up their lives to follow Jesus. They understood that Jesus, the Kingdom of God, is the pearl of great price to which nothing else can compare. Knowing what is truly important, we will finally be able to understand what it means to live for the "bare necessities" of life.

Sacred Heart Church in Richmond, TX is in the stage of revamping the Music and Liturgical ministry. We are seeking a well-trained choral director that can recruit new talents, increase our repertoire and bring us to the next level.

The Director of Music Ministry at Sacred Heart Church is responsible for planning, directing, and implementing music for all liturgical and Eucharistic celebrations within the parish.

The Director of Music Ministry reports to both the Parish Administrator and the Pastor.

THE GOALS FOR SACRED HEART'S MUSIC MINISTRY

- To foster “*full, active, and conscious participation*” of the community during the Eucharist by means of careful planning, repeated use of known repertoire, diligent rehearsal and preparation by the musicians, and transparent execution by the music ministry during the liturgy.
- To enhance liturgical prayer by providing quality, well-prepared music including traditional hymns, contemporary songs, Latin repertoire, choral and instrumental selections that match the scriptures of the day, thereby leading the assembly deeper into prayer.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Sunday Liturgies

- Plan all liturgies attentive to the needs of each season
- Attend Liturgy Committee meetings, staff meetings
- Prepare necessary music for rehearsals
- Coordinate volunteers, create calendars
- Schedule accompanists and cantors
- Rehearse adult and teen choirs weekly and additional choirs seasonally
- Prepare director, cantor, and accompanist books weekly
- Collaborate with Pastor, Director of Liturgy, and Director of Youth Ministry for a comprehensive plan for engaging youth at Sunday Eucharist.

Seasonal liturgies

- Plan seasonal liturgies of Advent, Christmas, Christmas Season, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and Easter Season
- Plan and prepare music for Holy Days and Feasts
- Plan Sacramental liturgies, Confirmation, First Eucharist, Penance services, and liturgies for Anointing of the Sick
- Recruit orchestra, prepare books for orchestra for Christmas, Easter, and other special liturgies

Non-Liturgical

- Facilitate Seasonal and Multicultural Concerts

Scheduling

- Weekly and seasonal scheduling of the cantors and accompanists for adults, teens, and children

Budget

- Plan, prepare, and maintain music budget

Payroll

- Submit payroll for accompanists on a biweekly basis
- Manage payroll for wedding and funeral cantors and accompanists
- Secure instrumentalists for holiday liturgies and plan payroll
- It should be noted that planning, accompanying or singing at weddings or funerals are considered part of the “ordinary” non-paid duties of the Director of Music as an “exempt employee” (The payment of stipends to the Director of Music is not permitted in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston)

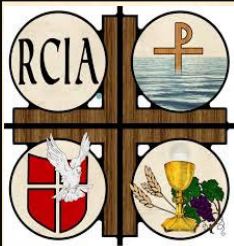
