OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP HOME AUXILIARY 75th Anniversary

History of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Home Auxiliary:

On March 3, 1939, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Home opened its doors in what originally was a Jewish orphanage. In March 1940, the Auxiliary was established by a group of Catholic women to assist the sisters in their "Labor of Love." Priests in the Catholic Churches of the Diocese, as well as the various religious orders, were generous not only in giving their services, but in interesting their parishioners in the work.

Many people volunteer their time and talent both Catholic and those of other faiths to the Home. They formed sewing circles which made pads and dressings, some furnished clothing, gowns and pajamas. Both men and women visit the residents, bring them delicacies, read to them, write letters for them, performing all the little services which mean so much to the sick. There were groups that came to do the laundry, sewing, cleaning, cooking, ironing, sitting at the front desk, or whatever needed to be done. Today there are paid employees to take care of these needs.

What is needed of the Auxiliary today is the monetary support for the needs of the Home.

In October 1956, the Auxiliary began an annual Champagne Luncheon and Fashion show to raise money. Today, it is still a Champagne Luncheon, but a Silent Auction has replaced the Fashion Show. The major fundraising project of the Auxiliary is an annual raffle, held in conjunction with the Luncheon. A majority of the parishes of the Atlanta Archdiocese participate in the raffle. All funds raised go directly to the Home with a small percentage withheld for operating expenses of the Auxiliary.



History of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Home:

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Home (Home) was established by the Hawthorne Dominicans for the care of incurable cancer patients without discrimination as to race, creed or national origin. The Sisters of OLPH hope that their patients will feel welcome in an atmosphere of peace and warmth — where love, understanding and compassion prevail. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Home accepts only patients with a diagnosis of incurable or terminal cancer who are unable to pay for adequate nursing care elsewhere.

The Home is supported entirely by the generosity of a sympathetic public. No remuneration is accepted from the patients or their families. The Our Lady of Perpetual help Home Auxiliary (OLPHA) sole purpose is to raise funds for the Home. We deeply appreciate the generosity of donors who ensure we're able to provide this care.

Membership and Registration

Welcome to St. Mary, Mother of God, Church. We would be delighted to have you join our Parish Family. Please complete a registration

Please do not take for granted that you are registered in the parish just because you attend Mass here or that you were registered as a child with your parents. When you become an adult, you should register under your own name. If not, it could become quite embarrassing to us, or to you or your family, if someone wants to make wedding plans, have a baby baptized, or if you have been asked to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation which requires a letter from us stating that you are a practicing Catholic. To do this, we should have a record of your membership and attendance. Please take a moment to register. If you have any questions, please call the Parish Office Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 pm. Thank you.

If someone in your family is admitted to one of these hospitals, the parish responsible for that hospital should be notified as well as notifying St. Mary, Mother of God, Church. They will have people serving that hospital on a regular basis and are closest in an emergency situation.

SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES

<u>Baptisms-</u> In order to have a child baptized in this parish: (a) at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic and a registered member of this parish for at least 3 months, and (b) the parents must take the Baptism Class unless they have taken the class within the last 3 years.

<u>First Holy Communion</u> —In order to receive First Holy Communion, a child must: (a) be at least 7 years old and a registered member of this parish, (b) be able to demonstrate sufficient understanding of the sacrament, and (c) have been in the Faith Formation program for at least <u>one year prior</u> to the taking the First Holy Communion program.

<u>Confirmation</u>— In order to be Confirmed, a youth must (a) be a baptized and practicing Catholic, (b) a registered member of this parish, (c) at least 15 years old or a sophomore in high school, and (d) have been in the Faith Formation program for at least 2 years immediately prior to the Confirmation program. (Adults and those in OCIA follow different guidelines.)

<u>Marriage</u> – A couple wishing to be married at St. Mary, Mother of God must fulfill these requirements: (a) at least one of them must be a practicing Catholic and registered in this parish (a former member of the parish or others must have a letter of permission from their current pastor authorizing them to marry outside of that parish); (b) they must have indicated to the priest or deacon of this parish their desire to be married here <u>at least 6 months prior</u> to the projected date of their marriage; and (c) have completed the required Marriage Preparation program. <u>No arrangements for a reception should be made until the date for the projected marriage has been confirmed by the Parish Office.</u>



Twentieth-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue." Jesus could have healed this deaf man another way. He could have spoken a powerful word or, for that matter, just silently willed that the man's health be restored. It wasn't uncommon for Jesus to cure people simply by a quick touch. But instead, Jesus chose to heal him in this unique way. He made it a private event, one that involved an unusual kind of physical ritual.

Clearly, this was not for Jesus' sake. And since it was away from the crowd, it wasn't for their sake either. This particular healing was for this particular man. For whatever reason, Jesus knew that this man needed these signs--touching his ears and putting saliva on his tongue--in order to be freed of his inability to hear and speak well.

Jesus knows what we need. His care for each and every one of us is not some standardized package of generic charity. He loves us all as unique individuals and understands us. He sees our weaknesses and knows our strengths. He offers himself to us as an intimate friend, not an unfamiliar acquaintance. When we come to him with our hopes, our fears, our desires and needs, he hears and answers us ... in the way he knows is best. It might seem odd. It might be unexpected or different from what we have seen him do for others. But we need to trust, even when we are desperate for "healing," that Jesus does care, that he does listen, and that he does act on our behalf.

Let us have confidence in today's Old Testament proclamation from Isaiah: "Thus says the LORD: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God ... he comes to save you."
