JUBILEE OF FATIMA - 2017

Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Immaculate Heart of Mary, most perfect receptacle of the fulness of God's grace, Heart most loved by God and most loving of Him, Heart most tenderly devoted to men and to their salvation, Heart made most sorrowful by our sins, Heart joyful in our charity, I consecrate myself entirely to thee.

O Immaculate Heart of Mary, in the fire of love which burns in thee, may all my sins be consumed and all my affections purified. Let me by true penitence draw out the painful thorns which I have pierced thee. May something of that divine fire of love which fills thee enter into my heart so that my service of thy Son may be complete. In lasting devotion to thy Immaculate Heart may I be willing to share its sorrow now, so that seeing thee in Heaven I may possess some of the blessed joy which thy Son imparts to it. Immaculate Heart of Mary, I am thine in sorrow and in joy, in time and in eternity. Amen.

Fr. McGlynn (1906-1977) met Sr. Lucia of Fatima who gave him directions as he sculpted the statue of the Immaculate Heart of Our Lady of Fatima which was completed on April 5, 1958 and which stands in the center and above the main entrance of the basilica at Fatima where it is seen by hundreds of thousands of pilgrims every year.

MEDITATION ON OUR PATRONS, THE HOLY INNOCENTS

by Archbishop Alban Goodier (1869-1939)

"Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, was in a furious rage, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time which he had ascertained from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah: 'A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they were no more.'"

Consider also Herod's innocent victims. There is much significance in the fact that they were not willing victims. They were too young to think or to choose; they were passive in their mother's arms and beneath the swords of their executioners; yet the Church has placed them in the vanguard of her martyrs. It has been so time and again in the history of the Church and in our own day, when Herod seems to have arisen in so many places; in Asia Minor, in Spain, in Portugal, in Mexico, in Belgium, it would seem to be reaching its climax. In all these places, where victims have been immolated out of hatred for the faith, without any power to say yes or no on their own part, there is for them and for us the joy of knowing that they are now spotless before the throne of God (cf. Rev 14:5) and witnesses to him, not only here but also for all eternity. God "chooses whom he will"; and if we place those he chooses for death on the battlefield upon the "Roll of Honor," no less should those be honored whom he chooses for death in his own cause.

ALTAR SOCIETY

CHURCH UNITY OCTAVE

The Church Unity Octave (also known as The Chair of Unity Octave) is one of the most special and richly indulgenced novenas of the Church year. It begins on January 18, the Feast of St. Peter's Chair in Rome and concludes on January 25, Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. It has accomplished an immense good in awakening Catholics to a mission consciousness and to the need of interesting themselves in the conversion of those outside the Fold. The intentions are as follows:

- January 18: The union of all Christians in the one true faith and in the Church
- January 19: The return of separated Eastern Christians to communion with the Holy See
- January 20: The reconciliation of Anglicans with the Holy See
- January 21: The reconciliation of European Protestants with the Holy See
- January 22: That American Christians become one in union with the Chair of Peter
- January 23: The restoration of lapsed Catholics to the sacramental life of the Church
- January 24: That the Jewish people come into their inheritance in Jesus Christ
- January 25: The missionary extension of Christ's kingdom throughout the world

Novena Prayers for these intentions will be recited following each Traditional Latin Mass on these days. In charity offer your Holy Communion and Holy Mass for these daily intentions. If you are not able to pray these prayers publicly, please take a leaflet from the church and pray them privately.



ST. PETER NOLASCO - January 28th



With St. Raymond of
Penafort, St. Peter
Nolasco founded the
Order of Mercedarians,
the religious community
which sent members as
ransom for Christian
prisoners in the hands
of the Saracens. Details
of his life are uncertain,
but he was probably a
native of Languedoc,
France. After taking part
in the crusade against
the heretic Albigensians
of southern France, he
became a tutor of King

James I of Aragon and then settled at Barcelona. There
he became friends with St. Raymond of Penafort, and in
1218, with the support of James I, they laid the
foundation for the Mercedarians, devoted to the
ransoming of Christian captives. Twice Peter went
to Africa to serve as a captive, and it was reported that
during one journey to Granada and Valencia he won the
release from Moorish jails of some four hundred captive
Christians. Retiring in 1249, he was followed as head of
the order by William of Bas. He was canonized by Pope
Urban VIII in 1628. His feast day is now celebrated on
January 28.
