"Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, was in a furious rage, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time which he had ascertained from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah: 'A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they were no more.'"

Thus is the malice of evil-doers everlastingly frustrated. They hack their way through to their own ends while every victim that they slay not only cries to heaven for vengeance but also adds to the glory and strength of that which the evil wish to destroy. Blood that is shed in whatever cause is usually a fruitful seed! The more noble, the more pure the blood, the better is likely to be the harvest. Thus, as nations pride themselves in giving of their best, so God seems to choose the choicest of his children for this honor—witness Fisher, More, Campion, and Arundel in our own country—that afterwards, in the fullness of time, “thoughts may be revealed.” Rachel may bewail her children because they are not; but Rachel is the mother of children more numerous than the sands of the seashore.

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS

This Saturday, February 4 is the First Saturday of February. The First Saturday Devotions will take place following the 1:00 p.m. Mass, consisting of the recitation of the Holy Rosary, a guided 15 minute meditation on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary, and Eucharistic Reparation and adoration in imitation of the Angel of Peace. The devotions last about one hour. Please plan on attending to answer the request of Our Lady to Sr. Lucia: "You at least try to console me."

CANDLEMAS

Thursday of this week, February 2 is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple and the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, also known as Candlemas Day. Candles will be blessed at the 7:00 a.m. Mass and available all day from the sacristan or Parish Office for a donation of \$5.00 per box. The Solemn Blessing of Candles and Procession will take place at the 6:00 p.m. Solemn High Latin Mass. All Catholic homes should have blessed candles which are to be lit whenever the priest brings the Blessed Sacrament on a Sick Call, during storms for protection, and to assist the dying during their final agony. Once blessed candles are a sacramental, reminding us of Christ, the Light of the World.

BLESSING OF THROATS

Friday of this week, February 3, is the Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, Patron Saint against diseases of the throat and one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. The traditional Blessing of Throats will take place on that day as follows:

Following the 7:00 & 7:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Masses
From 8:30-9:00 a.m. and from 11:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

THE FOURTEEN HOLY HELPERS



The Fourteen Holy Helpers are a group of saints venerated together because their intercession is particularly effective, especially against various diseases. This group of *Nothelfer* ("helpers in need") originated in the 14th century at first in the Rhineland, largely as a result of the epidemic (probably of bubonic plague) that became known as the Black Death.

The fourteen saints are: Sts. Agathius (May 8) invoked against headaches; Barbara (December 4) invoked against fever and sudden death; Blaise (February 3) invoked against illness of the throat and for protection of domestic animals; Catherine of Alexandria (November 25) invoked against sudden death; Christopher (July 25) invoked against bubonic plague and dangers while traveling; Cyriacus (August 8) invoked against temptation on the death-bed; Denis (October 9) invoked against headaches; Erasmus (June 2) invoked against intestinal ailments; Eustace (September 20) invoked against family discord; George (April 23) invoked for the health of domestic animals; Giles (September 1) invoked against plague, for a good confession, and for cripples, beggars and blacksmiths; Margaret of Antioch (July 20) invoked during childbirth, and for escape from devils; Pantaleon (July 27) patron of physicians and invoked against cancer and tuberculosis; Vitus (June 15) invoked against epilepsy, lightning, and for the protection of domestic animals. Fourteen Holy Helpers, pray and intercede for us who have recourse to you!
