JUBILEE OF FATIMA - 2017

PLEASE NOTE WELL: Even though the Green Scapular is not directly associated with the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima as is the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, it is a devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary (which Our Lady revealed to the three shepherd children during the June 13th apparition and again to Sr. Lucia on December 10, 1925 when She appeared with the Child Jesus in Pontevedra, Spain to ask for the devotion of the Five First Saturdays) for conversions, two aspects of the Fatima Message.

OUR LADY'S GREEN SCAPULAR

Saints Vincent de Paul and Louise de Marillac founded the Daughters of Charity in the 17th century to serve the very poor, first in the streets of Paris, and then throughout the world. In 1830, Our Blessed Mother Mary appeared to a Daughter of , Saint Catherine Laboure, giving her the Miraculous Medal devotion to spread worldwide.

On September 8, 1840, Our Blessed Mother Mary appeared to a Daughter of Charity, Sister Justine Bisqueyburu, giving her the Green Scapular. Sister Justine nearly cried out with excitement and joy when she first saw the Virgin Mary, dressed in a long white silken gown with a light blue mantle, with her hair hanging loosely about her neck, holding in her hand a Green Scapular. On one side was an image of Our Lady as she appeared to Sister Justine, and on the other an image of her Immaculate Heart, emitting brilliant rays of light, and pierced by a sword. Above her heart was a cross, surrounded by the inscription: *Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us now and at the hour of our death.*

An inner voice said, “By this means, God will bring to Himself, through the intercession of the Blessed Mother Mary, those who have lost their faith or have been separated from Holy Church. They will be assured of a happy death, including Eternal Salvation.”

Our Lady explained that the Green Scapular would hang by a string like a medal, and any priest could bless it without a special formula. Those needing conversion could wear it or it could be hidden in their clothes, bed, or room. Mary asked that the prayer on the Scapular be prayed daily by or for the sinner.

Our Lady said that the different sized rays falling from her hands were the graces available through the devout use of the Green Scapular, which are in proportion to the confidence, fervor, and sincerity of the person seeking them. Pope Pius IX approved the Green Scapular in 1863. He ordered the Sisters of Charity to make and distribute the scapulars throughout the world.

Sister Justine kept silent about these great blessings, revealing them only to her superiors. She was humble and obedient, a servant to all and faithful to her Order’s Rule. She treated all, especially the sick, with compassion and tender kindness as she ministered with her fellow nuns in hospitals throughout France, Algiers, and Italy. Sister Justine Bisqueyburu passed away peacefully in 1903 in Carcassone, France, a good and faithful servant to the end.

God gave us the Green Scapular at this time in salvation history because He knows how much we need Him, and how much we need His grace as we battle what Pope Saint John Paul II called the Culture of Death. Through this scapular, God helps us deepen our devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Our Lady. The promises and benefits of the Green Scapular include:

- Conversion of those who do not believe in Jesus.
- Reconciliation to the Church for those who have lost or strayed from the true faith.
- Assurance of a happy death.
- Strengthening of the faith for those already in the Church.
- Protection from Satan for those who wear or promote the scapular.

All of these wonderful promises flow from the selfless life, sacrificial death, and triumphant Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of Mary, our Savior and our truest Friend.

THE SEASON OF SEPTUAGESIMA (PRE-LENT)

Septuagesima is the ninth Sunday before Easter, the third before Lent, called also *Dominica Circumdederrunt* from the first word of the Introit of the Mass. This Church Liturgical Season begins the Easter Cycle. The Sundays of Septuagesima are named for their distance away from Easter. The first Sunday of Septuagesima gives its name to the entire season as it is known as "Septuagesima." "Septuagesima" means "seventy," and Septuagesima Sunday comes roughly seventy days before Easter. This seventy represents the seventy years of the Babylonian Captivity. The second Sunday of Septuagesima is known as "Sexagesima, which means "sixty". Sexagesima Sunday comes roughly sixty days before Easter. The third Sunday of Septuagesima is known as "Quinquagesima," which means "fifty" and which comes roughly fifty days before Easter. Quadragesima means "forty," and this is the name of the first Sunday of Lent and the Latin name for the entire season of Lent. Septuagesima and Lent are both times of penance, Septuagesima being a time of voluntary fasting in preparation for the obligatory Great Fast of Lent. Throughout this short Season and that of Lent (next Season) you will notice a deepening sense of sobriety, penance and somberness with the omission of the Alleluia and Gloria, culminating in Passontide (the last two weeks of Lent). Septuagesima is inaugurated in the Roman Martyrology by the words: "Septuagesima Sunday, on which the canticle of the Lord, Alleluia, ceases to be said".

FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE PASSION OF OUR LORD



Anima Christi

The author of this traditional prayer from the Roman Missal is unknown. It has often been attributed to St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556), for it was indeed a favorite of his and it appears at the beginning of his Spiritual Exercises. However, he could not have been its author for a copy of the prayer appears in a document from 1334, a good century and a half before St. Ignatius was born. Others have attributed it to Blessed Bernadine of Feltre (1439-1494), but again the prayer was around for at least a century before his time as well. The prayer is also known as the Prayer of St. Patrick and some scholars formerly placed the prayer's composition in seventh century Ireland. This too seems unlikely, since no copy that early is known to exist. The prayer carries a partial indulgence:

SOUL of Christ, sanctify me
Body of Christ, save me
Blood of Christ, inebriate me
Water from Christ's side, wash me
Passion of Christ, strengthen me
O good Jesus, hear me
Within Thy wounds hide me
Suffer me not to be separated from Thee
From the malicious enemy defend me
In the hour of my death call me
And bid me come unto Thee
That I may praise Thee with Thy saints
and with Thy angels
Forever and ever
Amen

HAPPY ST. VALENTINE'S DAY—FEBRUARY 14TH

Saint Valentine of Terni, a widely recognized third-century Roman saint commemorated on February 14 and since the High Middle Ages associated with a tradition of courtly love, was a priest of Rome. Valentine refused to sacrifice to pagan gods and was imprisoned. While under house arrest of Judge Asterius, Valentinus (the Latin version of his name) was discussing Jesus Christ. The judge put Valentinus to the test and brought to him the judge's adopted blind daughter. If Valentinus succeeded in restoring the girl's sight, Asterius would do whatever he asked. Valentinus laid his hands on her eyes and the child's vision was restored. Immediately humbled, the judge asked Valentinus what he should do. Valentinus replied that all of the idols around the judge's house should be broken, the judge should fast for three days, and then undergo baptism. The judge obeyed and as a result, freed all the Christian inmates under his authority. The judge, his family and his forty-four member household were baptized. Valentinus was later arrested again for marrying Christian couples so that the husbands wouldn't have to go to war, and for continuing to proselytize. He was sent to the prefect of Rome, the emperor Claudius Gothicus. Claudius took a liking to him until Valentinus tried to convince Claudius to embrace Christianity, whereupon Claudius refused and condemned Valentinus to death. He was beaten with clubs and stones; when that failed to kill him, he was beheaded outside the Flaminian Gate on February 14, 269. On the day of his execution he left her a note that was signed "Your Valentine". He was buried in the cemetery of Saint Hypppolyrus on the Via Flaminia close to the Ponte Milvio to the north of Rome on that day. In 1836, Pope Gregory XVI had the remains of the Roman martyr, Saint Valentine, taken from the cemetery and sent, encased in a gold bound casket, to Dublin, Ireland, where it remains to this day. St. Valentine, pray and intercede for us before the throne of God!
