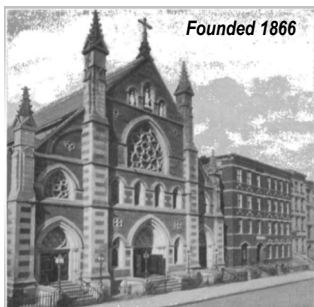

Fr. Miara's Solemn Prayer of Consecration

of Holy Innocents Parish to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

(prayed on October 13, 2017 - 100th Anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun)



Holy Mary, Virgin of Fatima, Mother of Mercy, Queen of Heaven and Earth, Refuge of Sinners, with renewed gratitude for your maternal presence we join our voice to that of all generations who call you Blessed. We celebrate in you the works of God, who never tires of looking down with mercy upon humanity, afflicted with the wound of sin, to heal it and save it. Accept with the benevolence of a Mother this Act of Consecration that we perform today with confidence, before this image of your Immaculate Heart and spiritually before your Miraculous Image in the Cova da Ira at Fatima. We are certain that each of us is precious in your eyes and that nothing of all that lives in our hearts is unknown to you. One hundred years ago at Fatima you spoke to the three little shepherd children: "My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge, and the way that will lead you to God," thus inviting the Church and the world to come to you. And so today we come to offer you our whole being, body and soul, faculties and senses, our life with all its sorrows and joys, all that we possess, all that we are, all that we love. Reign over us, O Beloved Mother, so that we may be yours both in prosperity and in adversity, in joy and in sorrow, in health and in sickness, in life and in death. Full of confidence in your powerful intercession with the Most Holy Trinity, I as pastor of this Shrine and Parish Church of the Holy Innocents commit myself and also this entire parish to your Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart. Receive us as thy children. Keep us under your maternal protection and lead us to your Son Jesus, the Light of the World, our Redeemer, our hope, and our salvation.

I consecrate and commit to you, O Mother of fair love, all the members of and visitors to this parish, past, present, and future, beginning with the weakest ones, from the unborn to the sick, the disabled and the elderly, the homeless and insane. I commit to you our Latin Mass Community, the workers who make up our weekday parishioners, tourists and their families, our children, our young people, the single and the widowed. I pray especially for dysfunctional, hurt and broken families, for the young who seek the meaning of life but who are getting lost in a world of alcohol and drugs. Comforter of the Afflicted, wrap your mantle of purity around all those in our parish burdened with the cross of same-sex attraction. Help the unemployed, the lonely and the desperate. I pray for those who have distanced themselves from the Church, for all of those within the boundaries of this parish living lives of hedonism and sin, devoid of God and His Holy Law. For the conversion of the Jews and Muslims who frequent this area and all other Christian sects who are not members of the one true Catholic, Roman and Apostolic Church, outside of which there is no salvation. O Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, accept all of those named into your merciful heart. Look with mercy upon all of us, Mother of the Sacred and Eucharistic Heart of Jesus, and please accept this consecration and use all of us to accomplish your designs in the world. Rule over us, together with the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ, Our King. Save us from the spreading flood of modern paganism; kindle in our hearts and homes the love of purity, the practice of a virtuous life, an ardent zeal for souls, and a desire to pray the Holy Rosary more faithfully. Make our hearts and homes and this parish your shrine, and through us, make the Heart of Jesus, together with your rule, triumph in every heart and home. Amen and amen!

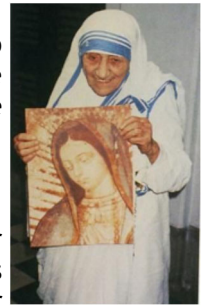
"When we walk the streets, in whatever part of the world, the sisters [Missionaries of Charity] carry in their hands the crown of the rosary. The Virgin is our strength and our protection."

"Our [Missionaries of Charity's] holy hour is our daily family prayer where we get together and pray the rosary before the exposed Blessed Sacrament the first half hour, and the second half hour we pray in silence."

"We are taught to love and say the rosary with great devotion; let us be very faithful to this our first love - for it will bring us closer to our Heavenly Mother. Our [Missionaries of Charity's] rule asks of us never to go to the slums without first having recited the Mother's praises; that is why we have to say the rosary in the streets and dark holes of the slums. Cling to the rosary as the creeper clings to the tree - for without Our Lady we cannot stand."

"The other day I can't tell you how bad I felt - there was a moment when I nearly refused to accept - deliberately I took the rosary and very slowly without even meditating or thinking - I said it slowly and calmly - the moment passed - but the darkness is so dark, and the pain is so painful - but I accept whatever he [Jesus] gives and I give whatever he takes."

INDULGENCES ASSOCIATED WITH EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

A *plenary indulgence* is granted to the faithful who:

1. Visit the Blessed Sacrament for adoration lasting at least a half hour;
2. Devoutly participate in a solemn Eucharistic procession, held inside or outside a church...;

A *partial indulgence* is granted to the faithful who:

1. Visit the Blessed Sacrament for adoration;
2. Offer any duly approved prayer to Jesus present in the Blessed Sacrament (e.g., the Adoro te devote, the prayer O sacrum convivium, or the Tantum ergo).

ST. JOHN NEUMANN (1811-1860) & THE 40 HOURS DEVOTION

At the time of his episcopate (1852-1860) there was a strong anti-Catholic sentiment in Philadelphia and having had two churches burned and another barely saved, priests were advising the Bishop, John Neumann, not to proceed with introducing the 40 Hours of continual adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, believing it would somehow increase the hostility already directed against the Church.

The Bishop had a decision to make and then something happened to make up his mind to proceed with the devotion of the 40 Hours of Adoration:

One night, he was working very late at his desk and fell asleep in his chair. The candle on the desk burnt down and charred some of the papers, but they were still readable. He awoke, surprised and thankful that a fire had not ignited. He fell on his knees to give thanks to God for protection, and heard His voice saying, "As the flames are burning here without consuming or injuring the writing, so shall I pour out my grace in the Blessed Sacrament without prejudice to My honor. Fear no profanation, therefore; hesitate no longer to carry out your design for my glory."

He introduced the practice of 40 Hours Devotion at the first diocesan synod in April, 1853, and the first devotions began at St. Philip Neri Parish, an appropriate place since that St. Philip had begun that very devotion in the city of Rome. The holy Bishop then introduced the program for the whole diocese, so that each parish would have Forty Hours Devotion during the course of the year. He wrote a booklet for the devotions and obtained special indulgences for the faithful attending them. The Forty Hours Devotion was so successful it spread to other dioceses. At the Plenary Council of Baltimore in 1866, the Forty Hours Devotion was approved for all Dioceses of the United States.

Let us ask St. John Neumann, lover of the Blessed Sacrament, to pray for us now and that we will again see the 40 Hours Devotion grow and flourish in our country and throughout the world.
