## Fr. Bob's Blotting's

A blessed Independence day to you!

I was talking with a friend from the east coast who was doing the usual bit of complaining about the weather, politics, and religion. I was feeling none too excited about recent events either, when I asked him: "Well, what would you say if you were a pastor?" He grew quiet and said: "I don't know."

In light of the Supreme Court's recent decisions, what do each of us, as faithful Catholics, say? What is your 15 second elevator speech? And are our thoughts in line with Christ's and his Church's? As you all know, I'm long winded, so these are my 30 seconds:

The easy route for us is not to walk the middle line. It is not to say we wholeheartedly agree and be just culturally Catholic as millions of our fellow Catholics have done. It is not to say that we disagree with all that has happened and it was better back in the good old days.

Marriage is a beautiful institution ordered to the union of spouses and the generation of children. The "in case you were wondering" sidebar helps to flesh out the perennial teaching of the Church. Government has the duty of protecting its future generations - procreation of children - this is one of the reasons nations have, for millennia, legalized marriage.

Being gay is not a sin. For years, church leaders and members have over-moralized the issue. In 1997, the Catechism of the Church highlighted the reality that many gay men and women experience: having the inclination is a cross that they bear. Again, see the sidebar.


