I remember one mom saying: at first my child didn't want to go, then I got a call saying he wanted to stay longer because there were more activities after the formal time.

Even if they can only come for one day, I encourage you to send them for this wonderful experience of Catholic education.

CORPUS CHRISTI - that darn Latin again, reminding us of our deep heritage! We celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ this weekend - not that we don't each week, but in a special way, our attention is draw to the Father's gift of Love, his only begotten son, the Word made flesh!

St. Jean Vianney once said: "if we knew what the Eucharist is, we would die, not out of fright, but out of love." True, isn't it? How rarely you and I act like Jesus is really present. We are casual, we make our reverences hastily, and we don't focus our attention on the mystery before us.

Yet, the WONDER OF WONDERS is that God is still so in love with us, that when the priest pronounces the words Christ spoke some 2000 years ago, Christ works today through his Spirit to effect the same change he worked that yesteryear.

As a priest, non-catholics and some of my own flock will challenge me saying that mass is the same as any service or that one communion is the same as another. I have to be gentle but firm in laying out the truth. Some are convinced of their opinions and their congregation's doctrines, but one bothersome fact remains: if they're all the same, why aren't we all of the historic and apostolic faith of the apostles? Did we all get it wrong? No, we believe that God, who is one, promised to keep the full deposit of faith in his barque, the Church, that has been faithfully steered by Peter and his successors.
