Coward to Courageous!

Thank you for the welcome you gave to Fr. Geditz! I hear that a lot of people enjoyed the stories in his homily. I hope to have a portion of his experience by the time I get to his age! What a wonderful testimony of the priesthood - never done with ministry, even after death! One of the chants at ordination is "You are priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek."

From the sounds of his visit, you are all primed up for Pentecost and the Spirit's gifts!

Speaking of gifts, here is a story of the gift of FEAR OF THE LORD: "Do not ride in automobiles: they are responsible for 20% of fatal accidents. Do not stay home: 1% of all accidents occur in home. Do not walk on the streets or sidewalks: 14% of all accidents occur at such times. Do not travel by air, rail, or water: 16% of all accidents happen on planes, trains or boats. Only .001% of all deaths occur in worship services in church, and these are usually related to previous physical disorders. Hence, the safest place for you to be at any time is at Church!!!"

Now for that funny Latin word again: TOTUS TUUS! It means *Totally Yours* in English, it's pronounced Toe-TUS Too-US and is a profound and fun experience of faith for kids of all ages. Catholic thought and teachings are witnessed to the kids instead of just lectured about; the time is interspersed with fun activities as well as opportunities for Mass and Confession for the younger grades: Fri. and Sat. schedules are: Grades 1-6 is 9am-2:30pm; Grades 7-12 is 7:30pm-9:30pm.


