Baltimore Sanctuary Network Meeting

Casa de Maryland has designated this weekend as "Immigrant Weekend" to honor all immigrants. Please join us this afternoon at 2 PM in the Community Center as we join with our partner congregation from St. Bartholomew Episcopal Church on Edmondson Ave.

This will be a chance to meet and socialize with each other, share ideas and concerns, plan future actions and activities here at St. Gabriel and with our partners from St. Bartholomew. St. Vincent de Paul Clothing Bin

The clothing bin located between the school and the annex is for the collection of new and good used, but, still usable, clothing. There is a sign on the bin that says the items must be placed in plastic bags and put inside of the bin. The common-sense reason for this is so that the clothing is not destroyed by the elements as has happened in the past on a few occasions.
