Notes from Social Action

St. Vincent de Paul Clothing Bin

The clothing bin located between the school and the annex is for the collection of new and good used, but, still usable, clothing. There is a sign on the bin that says the items must be placed in plastic bags and put inside of the bin. The common-sense reason for this is so that the clothing is not destroyed by the elements as has happened in the past on a few occasions.

Last weekend two large, leaf-size bags were placed on the ground in front of the bin. Each was filled to the top and the bags were open. If we had not discovered the bags on Sunday, the contents would have been ruined on Monday.

If for some reason you are unable to put your donations in small plastic bags and place them inside the bin, it would be better if you took them to either Planet Aid or Goodwill, both of which are located on Baltimore National Pike.
