Lent begins this coming Wednesday with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Traditionally this is a time of sacrifice and doing good works. At the end on Lent on Holy Saturday, March 31st, we will prepare and distribute food baskets to our neighbors in the community. To make this happen, we need everyone's help to stock the food shelves.

We are in need of all types of non-perishable food items, paper goods and cleaning products, pet foods, and personal hygiene products. Any of the following non-perishable food items will be greatly appreciated: <u>canned meats and fish,</u> <u>canned fruit, canned vegetables, all types of</u> <u>canned beans, canned pasta, canned soup,</u> <u>pasta & pasta sauce, dry beans & rice,</u> <u>peanut butter & jelly, pancake mix & syrup,</u> <u>hot & cold cereal, sugar, flour, coffee, tea, hot</u> <u>chocolate, juice and dessert items.</u>

If everyone could bring just one item every time he or she came to church, the food pantry would always remain fully stocked.



Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council is a community of faith, gathered in the name of Jesus to unify, plan, reconcile and energize the goals of a parish. In this context, the Council shares responsibility with the pastor for the mission and ministry of the Parish. The council is meant to bring together the wisdom, time, talent and other gifts of the community and plan the local mission. At St Gabriel Parish Council is comprised of 4 elected members (2 each year), as well as 11-13 parishioners that represent the Pastoral, Finance, Social, Spiritual and Service aspects of our parish.

The planning over the last five years has seen many victories, most notably a growing parish, the new parish hall, a robust welcoming process as well as many other smaller victories.

The time is now to plan the next phase of the Council and the commitments for the 5-10 years. As a result, the council, is interested in a review to determine the following:

Does its membership represent the parish needs, its objectives, serve its wider purpose. If changes are needed, then the framework should be reviewed and modified appropriately.

OPERATION MATO GROSSO Food Drive for South America

We are a group of young people who meet in our free time to carry out work projects to support Operation Mato Grosso's missions in 110 different communities across Brazil, Bolivia, Ecuador, and Peru. Our goal is to provide an opportunity for people of the local communities to remain in their villages to earn an income and improve their lives.

DURING THIS *LENT* KEEP IN MIND PEOPLE IN NEED

If you like to help place a basket in your dining room, and during the 40 days of Lent, every day put **one item** of food (listed below) in the basket. Every day before dinner, keep in mind that there are some people around the world that do not have enough to eat. It is a nice way to be thankful for what we have.

We collect 6 staple food items:PASTARICESUGARCANNED FOOD (veggies)FLOURCOOKING OIL

Food will be used in our programs – in our schools, where we provide free meals to our students, in soup kitchens where we feed elderly people or people who are not able to provide for themselves, to patients in our hospitals and clinics, and more.

Our objective is to fill an entire shipping a container of food to send to Peru, right after Easter. The Baltimore & Anne Arundel communities have already shown their generosity last year when we collected 38,000 lbs. We're not looking to match it; we aim to double this amount!
