HELP NEEDED

5. Maintain time schedule of event to ensure that facility cleaned, vacated and locked.

ST GABRIEL CHURCH

Over the past few months, there have been presentations at Masses discussing rebooting the St Gabriel Parish Council. The primary driver for this is Fr. Tom's retirement, likely to occur in the next few years. We will not likely have a permanent replacement, given the Priest shortage, yet the Parish must continue to be managed. A "parishioner led" leadership team can manage the daily social, service and administrative functions, while the spiritual needs can be met by a shared priest. This model is used by other parishes and is successful.

A consequence of a 'Parishioner-managed-Parish' is the need to be highly organized. The existing structure is somewhat varied, with some groups reporting to parish council or Fr. Tom, some decisions are made by Finance, others by committee, others through single decision making. While we are organized from some events, others require more work.

We also must support parishioners who have been volunteering their time and talent for a long time and they want to allow others to learn the activities, allowing them to take a step back. When these are reviewed in the 'big picture', St Gabriel has to do more to rise to the new challenge, and central to that is being organized to deliver. Planning and engagement for the long-term as well as preparing for the day where volunteers collaborate and ensure the parish is running successfully. We want everyone having the same understand of success.

To achieve this goal, the "reboot team" (See the list at the end) is completing these activities:

1. **Organizing:** Understand what each committee "does", identify gaps, reorganize, identify new roles and work to fill those roles
2. **Planning:** Review the Archbishop planning documents and question where we want to be in three years' time, and lay out goals
3. **Identifying:** Find and identify the leadership that represents our Parish, to deliver against these goals over the next three years. Elections and nominations are coming in the next 90 days, so that we have the people seated by October. Additionally, the new roles will need to be filled, so it's a great time to assess how you can help. The new roles are:

Communications Team- Take over all the various communication methods we have and build a team of volunteers to support the various needs, such as Facebook, My Parish App, Display Screens, Bulletins.

Hospitality Team- Build a team of people to support "Welcoming", not just at Mass, but at our events and meeting functions.

Administrative Coordinator- This person coordinates all administrative functions with the committee chairs, which includes: Maintenance Volunteers, Office Volunteers, Ways and Means, Money Counters, School Reuse, Facility Rentals and Communications team.

Service Coordinator- This person coordinates across the Social Action, Knights of Columbus, Volunteer committee and possibly other teams that serve specific missions.

Social and Diversity Coordinator- Consider this role as creating the 'United Nations of St. Gabriel', working with the Hispanics, Africans, Filipino, Social Club, Youth Group and build ways for us to acclimate better. We welcome your thoughts and prayers, but more importantly your time and talent to build towards our goal: Continuing to build the mission of St Gabriel of Woodlawn.

PARROQUIA SAN GABRIEL

En los últimos meses, se han realizado presentaciones en las Misas sobre el reinicio del Consejo Parroquial de San Gabriel. El principal impulsor para esto es la jubilación del Padre Tom, que es probable ocurra en los próximos años. No es probable que tengamos un reemplazo permanente, dada la escasez de sacerdotes, sin embargo, la parroquia debe continuar siendo administrada. Un equipo de liderazgo "dirigido por los feligreses" puede administrar las funciones sociales, de servicio y administrativas diarias, mientras que las necesidades espirituales pueden ser atendidas por un sacerdote compartido. Este modelo es utilizado por otras parroquias y tiene éxito.

Una consecuencia de una Parroquia administrada por los feligreses es la necesidad de estar *altamente* organizado. La estructura existente es algo variada, con algunos grupos que informan al consejo parroquial o al padre Tom, algunas decisiones son tomadas por el comité de Finanzas, otras por comité, otras por decisión individual. Si bien estamos organizados a partir de algunos eventos, otros requieren más trabajo.

También debemos apoyar a los feligreses que han ofrecido su tiempo y talento durante mucho tiempo y quieren permitir que otros aprendan las actividades, lo que les permite dar un paso atrás.

Cuando estos se revisan en el "panorama general", San Gabriel tiene que hacer más para enfrentar el nuevo desafío, y se está organizando para cumplirlo. Planificación y compromiso a largo plazo, así como la preparación para el día en que los voluntarios colaboran y se aseguran de que la parroquia funcione con éxito. Queremos que todos tengan el mismo entendimiento del éxito.

Para lograr este objetivo, el "equipo de reinicio" (consulte la lista al final) está completando estas actividades:

1. **Organización:** comprender lo que cada comité "hace", identificar vacíos, reorganizar, identificar nuevos roles y trabajar para completar esos roles
2. **Planificación:** revisión de los documentos de planeación del Arzobispo, y pregunta dónde queremos estar dentro de tres años, y establece objetivos.
3. **Identificando:** Encontrar e identificar el liderazgo que representa a nuestra Parroquia, para cumplir con estos objetivos en los próximos tres años. Las elecciones y las nominaciones se realizarán en los próximos 90 días, de modo que tengamos a las personas elegidas para Octubre. Además, los nuevos roles deberán completarse, por lo que es un buen momento para evaluar cómo puede ayudar. Los nuevos roles son:

Equipo de comunicaciones organiza todos los métodos de comunicación que tenemos y crea un equipo de voluntarios para satisfacer las diversas necesidades, como Facebook, la aplicación My Parish, pantallas, boletines, etc.

Equipo de Hospitalidad: crea un equipo de personas para apoyar "Recibimiento", no solo en la misa, sino en nuestros eventos y reuniones.

Coordinador administrativo: ésta persona coordina todas las funciones administrativas con los presidentes de los comités, que incluyen: Voluntarios de mantenimiento, Voluntarios de oficina, Medios y arbitrios, Contadores de dinero, Reutilización escolar, Alquileres de instalaciones y Equipo de comunicaciones.

Coordinador de servicios: ésta persona coordina a través de la Acción social, los Caballeros de Colón, el comité de voluntarios y posiblemente otros equipos que prestan servicios a misiones específicas.

Coordinador social y de diversidad. Considere este papel como la creación de las 'Naciones Unidas de San Gabriel', trabajando con los Hispanos, Africanos, Filipinos, el Club Social, el Grupo de Jóvenes y construyendo formas para aclimatarnos mejor.

Recibimos con agrado sus pensamientos y oraciones, pero lo más importante es su tiempo y talento para construir hacia nuestra meta: continuar desarrollando la misión de San Gabriel de Woodlawn.
