School Supplies Collection Project



Students will be returning to school in just a few short weeks. Our collection of school supplies will be held through September 2nd. The supplies will be delivered to the St. Francis Neighborhood Center located in the Reservoir Hill section of Baltimore City. Any items such as, but not limited to, pens, pencils, crayons, glue sticks, notebooks, folders, paper, rulers, backpacks, etc. that can be used by children in Pre-K through high school are acceptable. Please place your donations in the wagon in the Narthex.

Food Pantry

We are in need of all types of non-perishable food items, paper & cleaning products, pet foods, and personal hygiene products. All donations are greatly appreciated. At this time, however, the items most needed are: canned meats and fish, canned fruit, canned soup, Ramen noodles, pasta sauce, dry beans and rice, jelly, pancake mix & syrup, sugar/sweetener, flour, coffee, tea, and juice.

Please help your children select a food item that they can bring to the basket on the altar during the Offertory to help feed our hungry neighbors.

Please note that we highlighted the phrase "nonperishable" above. We have done this to point out problems that occur when perishable items are donated. Occasionally, people have donated fresh meat, fruit, produce, and bread. However, by the time these items were discovered some of the items had spoiled and had to be thrown away. This most recently happened on Thursday, July 26th, when we saw a box of 10 loaves of bread and rolls in the Narthex.

Six of them were covered with mold and we had to throw them away. We don't have a lot of space to store perishable items, but if you really want to donate some, please let someone in the office know so they don't spoil. Thank you. "Christmas in July" -- We want to thank everyone who donated to this worthy cause. Details will follow about the number of items collected for Project PLASE..

SCHOOL CLOSING III

Since my last publication on the status of our school building in the Spring of 2017, we have written a contract with Coldwell Banker in June 2017. Coldwell Banker has worked with several clients throughout the last year. These clients are engaged in day care pre-school, education and moral development of youth, and they run programs that are conducted after school hours and supplement the school curriculum. While the groups have been very interested in leasing our school building because of its functionality and location, they could not raise the necessary capital.

In May of this year, "Leaders of Tomorrow" submitted a LOI (Letter of Intent) with the needed capital and documentation for a Summer program and are currently renting our school. The mission of The leaders of Tomorrow, as you may have read in our bulletin, heard in announcements in church, as well as experienced in a presentation by the director, is to awaken the Arts in Education. St. Gabriel Parishioners were invited to enroll their children at a discount.

Coldwell Banker has been working with a new potential client who wants to lease the school building with an option to purchase after a period of time. The hope is to begin a lease for occupancy in the upcoming school year. Documents needed for the lease are not complete at this time and when they are submitted in the LOI I will be able to share more information.
