I am very grateful for this, you made a potentially difficult situation go very smoothly! Thanks again! Thank you too for your generosity at Christmas. We depend a good bit on the Christmas collection to help us through the fiscal year that ends June 30th.

Speaking of collections, we could use a few more regular ushers; people who normally attend a specific Mass. Having a core of “regulars” at all the Masses is a big help. There is a huge need for ushers at the 6:30pm Sunday night Mass. Any and all help is welcome. Please call the rectory if you can assist.

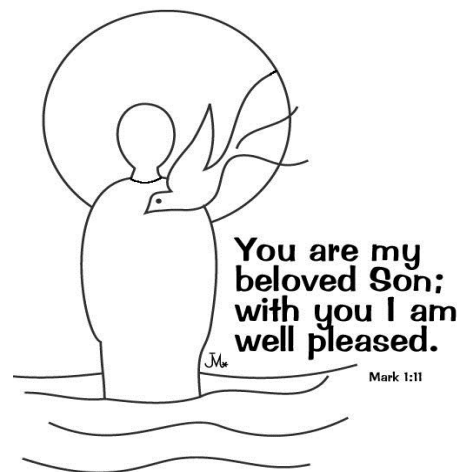
