

"There are no bad boys. There are neglected boys, mistreated boys, boys in trouble, but they are not bad." -Fr. Nelson Baker

At this time of year, we happily reflect upon the infant Jesus and the Holy Family. We remember our loved ones with gifts, and we decorate beautifully, making everything so radiantly alive. We give to the poor and those who serve the poor, to the homeless, and those without families.

Fr. Baker, a priest from Buffalo, New York, who was ordained in 1876, did so many kind things all year long that he became known as the "Apostle of Charity." This was long before there were federal agencies to take care of the needy. Among his great achievements : He established orphanages, homes for unwed mothers and their babies, residential halls for large numbers of boys from all over, an industrial school for the boys to learn various trades, and a hospital. Most of this was done in the area of Lackawanna, New York.

Hundreds of babies were adopted and thousands of boys who might never have had a chance for a decent life made it because of his successful efforts.

A book about his life is in our Spiritual Center Library. Known also for his great devotion to "Mary, Our Lady of Victory," he is now considered for canonization, having been declared "Venerable" on Jan. 14, 2011. Occasionally, his life story is featured on EWTN-TV. Surely, he was the "Apostle of Charity."
