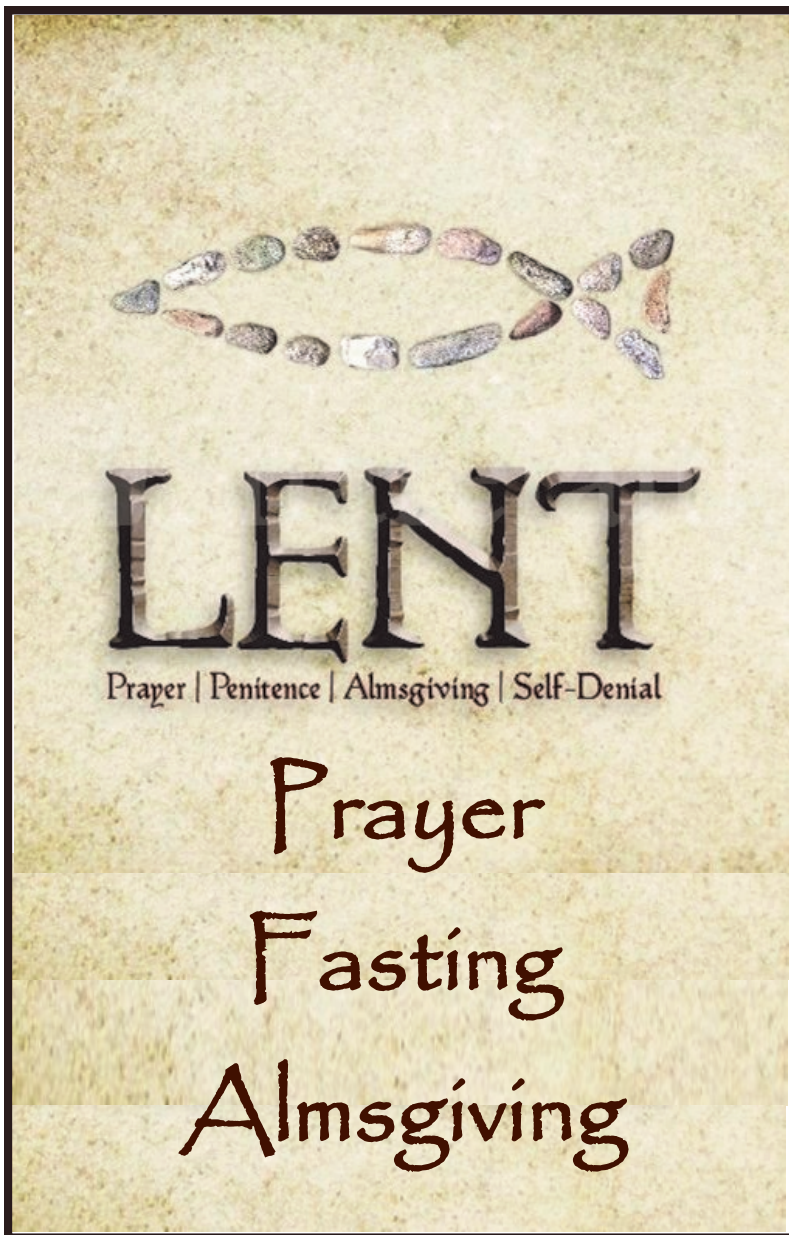

Lent 2015

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the holy season of Lent. It can be a time of great spiritual renewal for each of us. But if we only look to the Church's Lenten practices as merely forty days of "doing without some stuff" we can miss out on the central theme of Lent. On the other hand, if we try to see the potential of this great season, we have a great opportunity to come closer to the Lord.

The ashes of Ash Wednesday remind us of two things: our earthy mortality and that it is sin which causes death. As there is no Easter glory without Lenten sacrifice, neither is there Lent without Easter. Throughout the penitential days of Lent, we look with hope to the Resurrection of Christ which conquers both sin and death. Therefore we reflect on our own sinfulness not in a despairing way but with the hope of overcoming our sinfulness through the power of Christ. Lent is a time we humbly and honestly recognize that we need to be saved; and it is Christ - by his passion, death, and resurrection- who saved us.

It is within this framework that we carry out our Lenten fast. Pope Emeritus Benedict called Lent an "interior pilgrimage towards Him Who is the fount of mercy." But we do not make this pilgrimage alone, the Holy Father also adds, "[Lent] is a pilgrimage in which He Himself accompanies us through the desert of our poverty, sustaining us on our way towards the intense joy of Easter." All of our Lenten penance, self-denial, fasting, almsgiving, and prayer should be seen as the means by which we turn away from sin and back towards the Lord. When we strip away from ourselves all those excess things that surround us we can more easily see that it is the Lord and the Lord alone who brings us completion and happiness.

We must be concerned for others as well during our Lenten pilgrimage. Pope Francis reminds us in one of his Lenten messages, "Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty. Let us not forget that real poverty hurts: no self-denial is real without this dimension of penance. I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt."

So when we choose not to have that piece of chocolate cake or box of Cheez-Its, or when we abstain from meat on Fridays, or when we make the effort to pray more, come to Mass during the week or to come to Adoration or Stations of the Cross, do it with an intention. Say to the Lord, "I make this offering to you Lord, in love, to enable me to open my heart to the vast power of your love, transform me into your likeness. Help me to see that union with you is my goal and you alone can help me reach it. Help me to see the needs of others and be willing to give of myself for them."

I urge you, my friends, to take every opportunity this Lent to come closer to our loving God. I look forward to making this wonderful spiritual pilgrimage with you as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's glorious resurrection at Easter.

Fast and Abstinence

To foster the spirit of penance and of reparation for sin, to encourage self-denial, and to guide us in the footsteps of Jesus, Church law requires the observance of fast and abstinence (CCC 1249-1253).

- 1. Abstinence:** All persons who have already celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Fasting:** Everyone, from the celebration of their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Obviously, when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges.

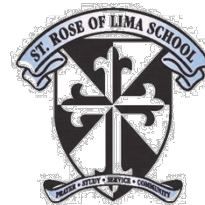

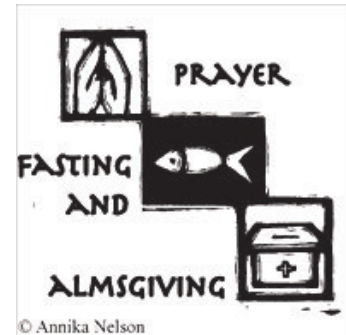
