Happy Valentine's Day?

I'm sure most of you know that the release of the sado-masochistic film, *50 Shades of Grey*, was on Valentine's Day; something which is more sad than clever. My take on *50 Shades of Grey*, which I have neither read nor seen, is pretty simple. I don't understand how torture is sexy and I can't imagine how it can be fun. I guess I am old fashioned that way. Before, we used to call people who enjoyed being hurt mentally unbalanced, as we did also people who enjoyed hurting others. Now, for some insane reason we think it's cool and sexy. No matter how slick or stylish we package it, sadism and masochism is wholly depraved and certainly not what it means to be truly human. And for those who might think "don't criticize what you don't know", I would respond that I don't have to drink a glass of battery acid to know that I won't like it and that it won't be good for me.

The profound and beautiful complementarity between men and women that God has written into our human nature is designed to help us to love and be loved. It is a complementarity that is defined by a mutual giving and receiving, but not a giving and receiving of torture. How distorted is our culture today that accepts such behavior as an appropriate way of expressing love and affection. Even dogs know better. You beat a dog enough and it will soon enough be either cowering in a corner or trying to bite your face off....it certainly won't be wagging its tail in joy. Yet millions of people have read a book and are spending millions more watching a movie that when boiled down, promotes one of the most distorted depictions of human sexuality as romanticism. Interestingly, and I guess sadly, most of the readers and viewers are women. What are they looking for? What lie have they been sold to think that abusive, selfish, and manipulative behavior toward them is not just OK but enjoyable? And what kind of man, who should cherish and honor the woman he loves, would think that dominating through torture and manipulation is the proper way to respect and honor women?

It really is a crazy world we live in where what is right is wrong and what is wrong is right. How many fathers and mothers want their daughters to go out with Mr. Grey? How many fathers and mothers would be proud of their sons if they treated women the way Mr. Grey does? We rebel at the thought, yet we buy the book and watch the film. Do we think our children aren't hearing about it, reading about it, seeing it? What kind of questions do you think they have? Would they even ask you? The pure insidiousness of this has to be putting a big smile on the face of Satan. You want a sadist, you want abuse, you want suffering and sadness? Pick him. You want someone to love you for who you are? Try God. Women should not stand for men who are abusive, nor should men take advantage of the gender confusion today that enables them to treat women as objects.

I know all this is pretty complicated and some of what I said is probably a bit simplistic. Yet, the beginning of the solution to any problem is to recognize there is one in the first place. I think this is where we need to start. With the help of God's grace and mercy, may we be able to recognize our contemporary culture's sordid distortion of human sexuality and be open to the truly fulfilling vision of it for which God has created us.

Save the Date for the Diocese of Camden Food Drive: March 1, 2015

Last year, parishes and schools throughout the diocese collected over 77,000 pounds of food, which is feeding thousands of our neighbors here in South Jersey. We're hoping to surpass this total in 2015 to hopefully reach 100,000 lbs. of food!

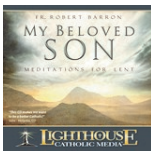

Many years ago, a little African girl in Canton, Miss., asked her parents if she could become Catholic. They consented. Eventually, she became a Franciscan sister, a scholar, a professor, a singer, and an eloquent, electrifying national speaker. We have a video in the Spiritual Center Library of her amazing life, #133. Sister Thea passed away in 1990, but her memory lives on. Books, and videos about other outstanding Catholics of African descent are available in the library, too. . Video #435, "The Sudan, the Hidden Holocaust," is also suggested. Video #373, "A Passion for the Faith," chronicles the history of black people in the Catholic Church. A book, "The Saints of Africa," is very enlightening, and DVD #42, "Two Suitcases," about Saint Josephine Bakhita, is an incredible portrayal of a slave who endured so much yet still forgave her torturers. All of these resources are in our library. In our Diocese, this month, we are proudly celebrating the contributions of black people to our Catholic faith.

Synod on the Family

In the spirit of dialogue, Pope Francis wishes to receive feedback from Catholics on the subject of family life in order to help the Church prepare for the Ordinary Synod on the Family that is scheduled for October 4-25, 2015.

During the coming weeks, attention will be on specific themes of the Synod: **Family Life** the week of the 2/22; **Marriage & Parenting** the week of the 3/1 and **Challenges Today** the week of March 8th.

This week, the Diocese of Camden is talking about the following questions concerning Family Life:

1. Describe how your parish supports those families experiencing additional stresses/tensions resulting from various life situations?
 2. How does your parish and community draw near families in extreme situations, e.g. poverty, isolation, in crisis, unemployed, etc?
 3. Describe initiatives your parish has in place to support and strengthen the bonds of marriage. Is there anything more that could be done?
 4. How can we as a community of faith, counteract the negative influences of the various 'isms' so often found in society today? e.g. individualism, materialism
 5. "**Love is our mission: The Family Fully Alive**" is the theme for the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia. Love, meant to be outward facing, is today often focused inward on itself. How can your family be helped to focus this love toward the world?
 6. How does your family experience God?
 7. How can your parish help you experience God in a broader sense?
 - a. What could your parish do to help your family grow in your experience of God?
 - b. Is your experience of family life one of joy?
 - c. How do you experience God's grace in your family's life?
- The Diocese will be holding sessions at parish level to discuss these questions in the upcoming weeks.

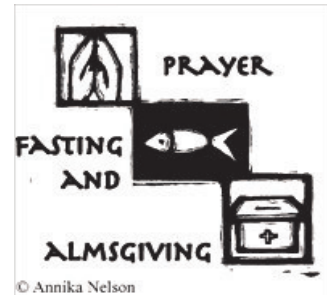
