

Superstition

Superstition is still a very common phenomenon today. One would think in our modern age we would have progressed beyond it but even as we have become more sophisticated, the roots of superstition run deep. As always, it helps to begin with how the Church understands the concept of superstition, and as usual, we can go to the Catechism for instruction. Superstition is when we separate a religious practice from the proper spiritual disposition of the heart and mind that must accompany it. As the Catechism states, "To attribute the efficacy of prayers or of sacramental signs to their mere external performance, apart from the interior dispositions that they demand, is to fall into superstition." (CCC n.2111)

In other words, when we believe that the mere carrying out of some external religious practice is what causes some desired outcome, we are being superstitious. In this regard, superstition is related to magic or sorcery, by which one attempts to "tame occult powers, so as to place them at one's service." (CCC n.2117) Anytime we seek by means of some ritualistic practice to control the outcome of future events is superstitious. I often think of the practice of putting a statue of the Blessed Mother in the window to ensure nice weather. No statue of Mary or of Jesus or of any saint has the "power" to affect the weather. It is superstitious to think so. While we can certainly ask the Blessed Mother to intercede with her Son Jesus on our behalf so that if it is God's will we have nice weather for a certain event, we cannot attribute any power to merely moving the location of a statue from one place to another.

Wearing medals of saints or other Christian symbols is a good thing; by honoring the saints, asking for their intercession with God, and reflecting on the example of their lives we can be helped to come closer to God. However, thinking that by the mere act of wearing a particular medal or other sacramental, we will be protected in some way is falling into superstition. No inanimate object has any power to change the course of events. It is God and God alone who has that power. We can (and should) constantly turn to God in prayer, asking him for our needs and seeking his protection. But we should avoid attributing power to any object or external practice.

So that means, of course, no upside down statue of St. Joseph buried in the yard in order to sell your house. By all means, ask St. Joseph to pray that you sell your house quickly, but you are not going to get an extra fast sale by treating an image of St. Joseph with such disrespect.

In the end, we need to make sure that we are always clear in our understanding of our religious practices. When they are bound to our hearts as an offering to God that we place before him to act on according to his will, we will never have to fear falling into superstition.
