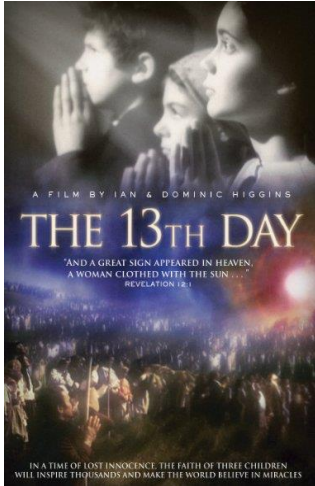

Minutes for Parish Council Meeting (May 4, 2015)

1. The new youth members, Zach Morman and Amber Ellerbrock, were welcomed to the council, and the outgoing youth, Ben Deitering and Anna Bellman, will be thanked for their service. 2. We listened to comments made since the campaign began. Some parishioners asked if donations of stock were possible. Jerry Hanneman will check with the diocese on how stock donations are to be handled. Others would like to donate to a specific project. Council agreed that is fine with the understanding that projects deemed necessary will be completed first. There are extra packets in the back of church. It is being mentioned in the bulletin that if any parishioner did not receive their packet, they can contact the parish. 3. Eucharistic Day is set for June 7, 2015. The council members will help with setting up, serving drinks at the meal and cleaning up afterwards. 4. We were asked about the possibility of getting an icemaker in the kitchen. We decided not proceed at this point since we’re not certain it would get used regularly enough to be feasible. 5. It has been 6 months since the last time the church carpet was cleaned. We have a quote of \$495 to clean the sides, back, front and middle aisle ways. Dale Warnecke made a motion to have the work done. Jan Schroeder seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 6. The idea of having a handicap button installed at the North-East door, by the ramps, was suggested. There are two places we can ask for more information. Jerry Hanneman will check into this. 7. The chimney on the Parish Center will be inspected to see what should be done to prevent future problems. The storm drains will also need to be fixed soon. 8. The renters will be in the rental house through June. There are possible future renters that are interested. 9. At the cemetery, new grass will be planted where soil was added, a few old trees will be trimmed out, and new trees planted. The paths will be blacktopped as well. FERVORINO The "troubled and abandoned" children in our world are "sheep without a shepherd." Jesus asks our "hearts be moved to pity for these children" and reminds us. Without cost you received, without cost you must give. Go to the lost sheep."

The Missionaries of the Precious Blood, who celebrate 200 years as a religious congregation this year, were founded by St. Gaspar del Bufalo in Italy in 1815. Saint Gaspar was often very hard on himself, but was quite compassionate and gentle with others. When a student was becoming discouraged over his lack of spiritual progress, Gaspar wrote: "...sometimes we have to say to ourselves, 'I just do not have the legs for doing it...I shall move along slowly'." In another letter he writes, quoting Philippians 1:6: "...be courageous, for 'he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion'." He also would counsel: "In certain cases, if one were to seek to achieve the optimum, then one would not achieve even the good." In other words, demanding perfection of others or of ourselves may prevent us from achieving the good. O Lord, as we do your work this week, help us not to let the perfect get in the way of the good!

registered in the parish; need to be aware that we cannot schedule a wedding date until six months after the time of registration. The normal six month preparation period would apply from that point. Normally only parishioners and those related to our parishioners marry here. Any other person needs prior permission of his/her pastor.

PARISH POLICY FOR CYO HIGH SCHOOL & PUTNAM COUNTY GRADE SCHOOL BOY'S & GIRL'S SPORTING TEAMS ANNOUNCEMENT: Playing any sports this year? You are expected to attend both the Fall & Winter sessions of High School Religious Education Groups or Grade School CCD Classes---plus weekend Saturday or Sunday Mass. This includes all players, coaches and their families. Attendance at these groups/classes will be monitored and reviewed. For each class missed (which is not an excused absence) you will be sitting out one game.—**To play CYO sports, the following are the only excused absences from CCD: sickness, death in family, college visitation day, parish sponsored event, sport tournament games only with O-G athletes/fans involved, and work (up to 3 missed CCD classes due to work). After the third absence due to work, the player is not permitted to play in a game until he/she returns to CCD class.** All other reasons are unexcused. Parents, if your child is sick, please call his/her teacher/leader before class. If necessary, the Parish Council will review attendance or unexcused absence issues on an individual basis. We kindly ask the cooperation of all concerned as we implement this church policy for the good of our parish. **Any non-Catholic youth** living in our parish is eligible to play CYO sports, if they regularly attend our parish High School Religious Education Groups or Grade School CCD Classes & plus regularly attend their Sunday service. This must be documented with their pastor's signature that they attended services each week during pre-season practices and regular season games.
