Minutes for Parish Council Meeting(10-20-2014) 1. The work on the Marian shrine, trees, and the carpet cleaning in the church has been completed. The shrine work was accomplished under budget, so Fr. Horstman's monument will be taken care of too. 2. Some men of the parish have volunteered their labor to build and install coat racks and museum cases into the old locker areas of the Parish Center hallway. They can begin the work after Thanksgiving. The museum cases will be used to display historical parish items to showcase our church's heritage. The money will come from the parish center funds, and an anonymous donation has already been received to help offset the cost of the materials. Approved motion to have the coat racks and museum cases installed into the first sets of locker areas. 3. An event calendar of parish activities was discussed. Approved motion to put in calendar format. 4. Parish Center security was discussed, and a question was raised about whether to raise rent at the Old Sister's house. More thought will be given to both items before decisions are made. 5. Regarding church lighting: Some light bulbs are no longer being made, and others are expected to be discontinued in the future. The newer CFL's and LED's were ordered for evaluation. The council has been invited to go to St. Joseph's church in Wapakoneta to see their new lights and gain information from their experience. This will be done in November before the next meeting. 6. The Capital Campaign Committee met and gave us ideas for a pledge card, prayer card, informational flyers and exterior signboard for our review. A letter was sent to all parish families to explain the focus of the campaign and make them aware that the money raised will stay 100% in the parish. We will be looking at getting 3 bids for each project. Information will also be available at St. Bonifest. Window Creations gave us a quote on all the windows, valid until the end of 2014. They will offer a discount if the entire project can be done at once. This is under consideration, since the storm coverings for the windows is the biggest concern. 7. It was advised that before any possible church painting project, fiber glassing should also be considered. For it can help increase the lifespan of the paint on the church walls/ceiling. This would be done as long as there continues to be no moisture issues. We went over notes taken from Conrad Schmitt's visit on the fiber glassing and painting projects they are proposing. They suggested doing a sample section first to evaluate. Two more quotes will be obtained before any decisions are made, and we will inquire about the ability to photo-shop pictures to compare new ideas with what exists now. 8. For prioritization purposes only, parish center projects were reviewed. These include, but are not limited to, gym acoustics, preschool playground equipment, chimney, making gym doors next to preschool "exit only," restroom updates (all), smoothing out bumps in the carpet for safety, refinishing the doors, and the economic possibility of air conditioning in the kitchen and gym. Minutes for Parish Council Meeting (11-19-2014) 1. Locker removal in the parish center has begun. Artifacts and pictures are being collected and organized. Donations of historic parish articles will be sought from parishioners. 2. The work on Fr. Horstman's monument in the Pioneer Cemetery is complete. 3. The council reviewed 3 bids given for painting and fiber glassing the church and discussed the pros and cons of each. More information will be requested before any decisions are made, and we will decide what work would be the most beneficial for the church. Tours of the areas that need attention will be offered throughout Thanksgiving week. 4. We looked at the new lighting at St. Joseph Church in Wapakoneta. The LED lighting looks good, comparable to our existing lighting, and their parishioners are happy with it. We will continue to research this. Sample fixtures may also be requested if necessary. 5. A motion was approved to increase the rental fee by \$20 per month at the former parish center starting January 1, 2015. 6. Regarding security at the parish center: before replacing locks or anything else, a policy needs to be in place. <u>Minutes for Parish Council Meeting(12-22-2014)</u> **1.** The council reviewed information from Conrad Schmitt's recent visit, noting the areas needing to be fiber-glassed, ideas given on painting enhancements to various areas of the church, wood graining the choir loft and having a rendering done of all the work proposed. It is hoped that if the funding is in place, work could begin in January 2016 and be done by that Easter. **2.** We received a response from the diocese giving permission to begin the fundraising campaign after April 11, 2015. They have stipulated that before each project is begun, we need to have received at least 50% and then have the remainder in pledges. A motion was approved to accept Conrad Schmitt to do the painting and fiber-glassing of the church. **3.** With work on the coat racks and museum display cases underway in the parish center, updated estimates have been given for potential completion of the remainder of the hallway. The projected cost of renovating each 8-foot display section is \$750, slightly higher than

original estimates. Donations of money, labor and materials have been given. There are currently 420 items available for display. **4.** Jerry Hanneman reported that the Finance Council approved a contract with Window Creations to replace the remaining storm windows on the church for \$325,512.
