LITURGY CORNER

Today is the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Continuing our look at the Early Church... We have the Apostles, Holy Scripture, and the writings of the early Church Fathers on which to base our current liturgies. But what did the Apostles, and Jesus himself, have? We need to keep in mind that Jesus was a Jew and that his apostles were Jews. “They conducted their lives and worship according to the patterns established in the law and tradition of Israel. From childhood, Jesus made regular pilgrimages to the holy city, Jerusalem, for the holy days. There he worshiped at the Temple, participating in the sacrifices offered by the people through the priests. Weekly, or perhaps more often, he attended a synagogue, the houses where rabbis proclaimed and taught from the law and the prophets, and where the congregation prayed from the Psalms and other ritual prayers.” (The Mass of the Early Christians) It is probable that Jesus held weekly solemn “fellowship meals” (*chaburah*) with his disciples; times where groups of family and friends got together for a meal which began with the blessing of the bread and wine. These meals were probably conducted in homes, were somewhat formal events, and included standard ritual washings and prayers (*berakoth*). “A form of sacrifice with which Jesus was surely familiar was the *todah*, or ‘thanksgiving.’ The *todah* was an offering of praise in gratitude for deliverance from some dire circumstance.” Psalms 22 and 116 were some of the psalms of the *todah* and were part of the thanksgiving meal.

3 more Great Reasons To

Have Another Child

The Great Recession in 2008 sent American birth rates into sharp decline. The total number of births has dropped below 4 million and stayed there. Now that economic growth is picking up again, birth rates should follow that same upward course, if history is any guide. The forces arrayed against such an American renaissance are powerful, however. The radical feminist and radical environmental movements, for instance, have twisted the virtue of childbearing into the vice of overpopulation. Planned Parenthood—still funded with our tax dollars—sends hundreds of thousands of unborn children prematurely to their graves. The culture itself is predominantly anti-natal. Christian parents know that children are blessings from God but, buffeted by these forces, they often need further encouragement to accept additional "blessings." We at Population Research Institute are happy to provide such encouragement. We believe, as we recount on the following pages, that there are at least ten great reasons to have another child.

Choose life, so that you and your descendants may live

Reason 1a

Have another child so your sons will have brothers and your daughters will have sisters.

Children who have siblings learn early to share. They learn to take turns and to put the needs of others before their own. The bond formed between brothers and sisters is lifelong, and stronger than the bond between the closest friends.

Reason 1b

Have another child so your daughters will have brothers and your sons will have sisters.

Boys who have sisters learn the dignity of women. They learn to treat other girls and women with respect, as they consider how they would like their own sisters to be treated. Girls who have brothers learn the complementarity of men and women, both fashioned in the image and likeness of God.

Reason 2

Have another child so you (and your parents) won’t be lonely in old age.

Reason 3

Have another child because people are our greatest resource.
