## ~ Liturgy Corner ~

Today is the Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, *Corpus Christi*. It is customary and desirable to have a procession on this day which will take place after the 12:00 Mass. Participation in this procession is a blessing to each of us and to the parish. On this feast day, let’s look at the ministry of Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. The ordinary ministers of Holy Communion are priests and deacons. “Ordinary”—“Ordained”. However, by 1965, Pope Paul VI began to grant permission for others to administer communion. As the numbers of parishioners increased and more of them came back to the Eucharist, access to receipt of Holy Communion needed to be made easier. In 1973, Pope Paul VI wrote an instruction, *Immensai caritatis*, noting, “The faithful who are special ministers of communion must be persons whose good qualities of Christian life, faith and morals recommend them. Let them strive to be worthy of this great office, foster their own devotion, to the Eucharist, and show an example to the rest of the faithful by their own devotion and reverence toward the most august sacrament of the altar.” It is an honor to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ to the faithful. It is also important that ministers be trained and installed (which appropriately takes place on Corpus Christi). We treat Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament with love, reverence and respect. “The Body of Christ.” “The Blood of Christ.” To which we respond, “Amen”. Two trained ministers at each Mass act as captains. The captains set up the vessels, wine, and hosts before Mass and then wash and put away the vessels after Holy Communion is distributed. If you feel called to the Ministry of Extra-ordinary Minister of Holy Communion, call the parish office and watch the bulletin for the next training session.

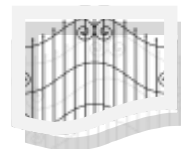
