## ~ Liturgy Corner ~

This week let's look at some of the symbols of Lent and Holy Week. Each liturgical season has its own color. The color for Lent is violet or purple which is symbolic of penance. The color for Holy Thursday, Easter, and the Easter season is white, symbolic of purity and integrity of the life of faith. The color for Palm Sunday and Good Friday is red, symbolic of the supreme sacrifice of life for the love of God. The penitential nature of the season of Lent is a time of purification for those preparing to receive the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—at the Easter Vigil. It is during this time that, on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, unbaptized adults participate in the Scrutinies. Scrutiny means to search or examine. Lent is a time of scrutiny for each of us—an examination of conscience during this penitential season—as we, too, move toward Easter Sacraments. The red we see on Palm Sunday and again on Good Friday and the reading of the Passion on both days leads us through Holy Week. The procession at the beginning of Holy Mass and receiving palms on Passion or Palm Sunday recalls Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of the last week of his life on earth. It is also customary, but not mandatory, that crosses and images in the church be covered on the Fifth Sunday of Lent.


