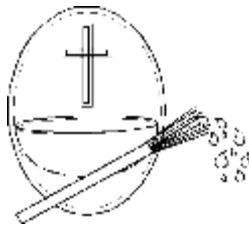

LITURGY CORNER

Last Monday was the 16th anniversary of the tragic events of September 11, 2001. In remembrance of firefighters, police officers, and emergency medical technicians, a “Blue Mass” may have been celebrated sometime this past week. A “Blue Mass” is called that because those individuals predominantly wear blue uniforms. It honors those who have died in the line of duty and those currently serving as first responders and is an opportunity for a community to show their gratitude. It dates back to September 29, 1934 when the first Blue Mass was celebrated at St. Patrick’s Catholic Church in Washington, DC and was timed to coincide with the feast of St. Michael the Archangel, the Patron Saint of police officers. Also celebrated on Thursday was the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast day commemorates the discovery of the Lord’s Cross by the empress, St. Helena in 320. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1085), “the event of the Cross and Resurrection abides and draws everything toward life”. The feast originated in Jerusalem and was generally adopted following the building of the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Rome, called that because it was the place of enshrinement of a major portion of the Cross of Crucifixion. This week we celebrate the Memorial of Saints Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Paul Chong Ha-sang, and companions. These Korean martyrs worked to spread the Catholic Faith by smuggling Rosaries, statues, and catechisms, as well as missionaries into Korea. Saint Andrew Kim Tae-gon was the first Korean native to be ordained to the priesthood. Also this next week we celebrate the Feast of Saint Matthew. He was a despised tax collector who converted from his sinful life when Jesus called him to be one of the 12 Apostles. He is credited with writing the first Gospel. He is believed to have died a martyr’s death in Persia or Ethiopia. All those whose lives we celebrate believe... *We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your Cross you have redeemed the world.* Gay Snell
