


**LITURGY CORNER**



This Saturday, September 29 was the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. The word “angel” comes from *angelus*, Latin for “messenger.” On October 2, we celebrate the Memorial of The Holy Guardian Angels. Angels are spiritual beings created by God. They are intelligent and have free will and they glorify God without ceasing and serve as messengers of his saving plan. The Archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael are God’s envoys. Michael, a name meaning “who is like God”, was the leader of the angels battling Satan and his followers and evicting them from heaven. (See Revelation 12:7-9) He has four offices: to fight against Satan; to rescue the souls of the faithful from the power of the devil, especially at the hour of death; to be the champion of God’s people; and to call away from earth and bring men’s souls to judgment. Gabriel, “the strength of God” or “the power of God”, appears in the Book of Daniel and again in Luke (Luke 1:26-38), where he bears tidings of hope to Zechariah and then to Mary. Tradition also identifies Gabriel as the angel who appeared to Joseph and to the shepherds, and was the comforter of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Raphael, “Healer of God”, is assumed to be the angel who, as told in John 5:4, “troubled the water”. He also plays a key role in the Old Testament book of Tobit. He is invoked against all sickness—physical, mental, or spiritual—and against possession by spirits. In the Gospels, angels announced the birth of Jesus, worshiped him, ministered to him after his temptation in the desert, and came to his aid in his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. The angels are present at every Holy Mass—as we hear in the Preface—the prayer that leads us into the *Holy, Holy, Holy (Sanctus)*. *Have a good week in the Risen Lord, Gay Snell*
