Our Lady of Fatima 100 Year Anniversary St. Cletus Catholic Church - May 3 & 4

A marvelous miracle occurred in the sky above Fatima before 70,000 witnesses on October 13, 1917 when the world was in the midst of World War I. As a great sign of the whole message coming truly from God, the miracle occurred with the sun. All could stare perfectly at the sun without blinking, or even hurting their eyes. While all were watching the sun, it rotated, got large and small, got close to the people, and got far away from them. The sun "danced". Every single person who was there testified to seeing the sun dance, even non-believers who immediately dropped onto their knees and begged for forgiveness.

This occurred at the time, date and place that Lucy and the other two children prophesized in the name of Our Lady of Fatima. The message of Our Lady to the shepherd children was that mankind must turn from its evil ways and return to God, our Creator and Lord. As part of this miracle, Our Lady revealed herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary."
