Easter Sunday

Happy Easter! We celebrate The Resurrection Power of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who From the Pastor brings New Life after death. This is what we can experience when we die to our sinful nature and stop doing evil; e.g. we stop being angry, lustful, slothful, envious, greedy, gluttonous and prideful. 




