The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ: It is good that we celebrate remembrance of our Lord's Death and Resurrection, as our Lord Jesus reveals that

Resurrection from death is possible through Him for those who believe. Our Lord told us and showed us that there is New Life that we can experience, in and through The Resurrection Power of Jesus Christ. On Holy Thursday at The Last Supper, Jesus tells us that He was "fully aware that the Father had put everything into his power." (Jn13:3) Jesus reminds us again of this fact at the Sea of Galilee after He Ascended into Heaven where He appeared to the apostles and said, "All Power in Heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Mt 28:18). Jesus shares His Amazing Power of Grace with us in the Sacraments through Baptism for the forgiveness of our sins so that we can be reconciled with God and receive Jesus in Holy Communion. As we choose to reject sin and do what God says, then we believe and can be Confirmed in The Holy Spirit, so that we can receive the additional Graces of God to sustain us in our vocations, whether in married life, single life, religious life or in the priesthood.

Jesus' Resurrection is death to the evil of sin, as Jesus raised His dead human body back to life. No science, medicine or medical procedure of science can do this after three days of being physically dead in a tomb. Death was satan's greatest victory over God's children, as death refers to an eternal separation from God. However, "God so loved the world(us) that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (Jn 3:16) God became a man and revealed His Mighty Power as God in the Truth He spoke that aroused Faith, Hope and Love in the hearts of people to believe. Through that Faith, Hope and Love, God is able to actively work in our lives in miraculous ways. Jesus never sinned and that is why the evil of the eternal death had no power over Him. The Greatest miracle is when we choose to reject the evil of sin and destroy the power of evil in us by accepting God's Ways so that The Power of The Holy Spirit given to us through Jesus Christ's human life, death and resurrection becomes active in us. It is The Holy Spirit that gives us a New Way, and creates in

us a new attitude through Faith, Hope and Love. This is what we have been working at throughout these past 40 days, as we worked to make the sacrifices of dying to sin in our lives and seeking God more intensely.

Freedom from Sin is Life in God:

(1)What then shall we say? Shall we persist in sin that grace may abound? Of course not! (2) How can we who died to sin yet live in it? (3) Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? (4) We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

(5) For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. (6) We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. (7) For a dead person has been absolved from sin. (8) If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. (9) We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. (10) As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. (11) Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as [being] dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus." (Rom 6:1-11) Dying to the evil of sin, is at the same time, a rising in Jesus Christ by The Power of The Holy Spirit to a New Life in God, for none of us can turn away from the evil of sin by our own will and power, rather it is by The Grace and Power of God, that all things are possible. God resurrects His Divine Life in our fallen human nature through those who believe. God gives The Life of The Holy Spirit(The Life of God) to our souls, so that we may become The Image and Likeness of God (Gn 1:27) and Temples of The Holy Spirit (1 Cor 6:19) which is to be Holy. "(13) Therefore, gird up the loins of your mind, live soberly, and set your hopes completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. (14) Like obedient children, do not act in compliance with the desires of your former ignorance (15) but, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct, (16) for it is written, 'be

holy because I [am] Holy" (1 Pt 1:16) To be Holy is to be without sin. "So be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48). This is New Life; This is Resurrected Life in Jesus Christ as The Joyful Love of God enters into our soul, by lifting us up beyond ourselves to Life with God and in God both now and one day for ever.




