God and Souls. An Act of Oblation (Oblation means a religious offering)

"Before heaven and earth, before all the choirs of Angels, before the Most Holy Virgin Mary, before all the Powers of heaven, I declare to the One Triune God that today, in union with Jesus Christ, Redeemer of souls, I make a voluntary offering of myself for the conversion of sinners, especially for those souls who have lost hope in God's mercy. This offering consists in my accepting with total subjection to God's will, all the suffering, fears and terrors with which sinners are filled. In return, I give them all the consolations which my soul receives from my communion with God. In a word, I offer everything for them: Holy Masses, Holy Communions, penances, mortifications, prayers. I do not fear the blows, blows of divine justice, because I am united with Jesus. O my God, in this way I want to make amends to You for the souls that do not trust in Your goodness. I hope against all hope in the ocean of Your mercy. My Lord and my God, my portion—my portion forever, I do not base this act of oblation on my own strength. but on the strength that flows from the merits of Jesus Christ. I will daily repeat this act of self-oblation by pronouncing the following prayer which You yourself have taught me, Jesus: "O Blood and Water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a Fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You." (St. Faustina Diary #309)

St. Faustina's faith in our Lord Jesus has enabled her to understand what the Image and Likeness of God is all about. Jesus came to establish Divine Truth, Mercy and Love in human beings, in other words, The Divine Presence of God is entrusted to us, which enables us to be like Jesus on earth through the power of Baptism and the other Sacraments. Jesus gives us the command, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me," (Mk 8:34). This means that we are to do what Jesus did, as He took on the humiliations and the sufferings of our sins and offered them to the Father in faith, hope and love as reparation for the sins of all people. This is what we are called to do, in addition to, making atonement for our personal sins. St. Faustina takes up the cross, as she willingly suffers for other people just as Jesus did in the agony in the garden when His soul was sorrowful to such a degree that it brought Him to the point of death, and He said, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done" (Lk 22:42).

St. Faustina willingly offers her prayers and embraces personal sufferings for sinners. She says; "I offer everything for them: Holy Masses, Holy Communions, penances, mortifications, prayers." She offers "everything," which is all of the Spiritual Blessings in Heaven that come to us through The Sacraments: Mass, Holy Communion and Confession, which means that she sent all of the spiritual consolations that she would have received through the Holy Sacraments, to assist other people to convert from their sins/ evils to Faith in Jesus. St. Faustina is also offering her personal mortifications and prayers for the sake of sinners. Mortifications are the ways that we die to sin/evil, by refusing to do evil when tempted to do so and responding virtuously during times of temptation. But always remember, if you decide to make such an offering, make sure that your Faith, Hope and Love are strong enough to keep you from falling into sin. If you are too weak at this time, then it would be better for you to receive the strength and consolations in the Sacraments to keep you free from sin/evil.

Jesus gave St. Faustina a powerful prayer to remind us of Jesus' Sacrifice, which bestows on us The Graces of His Divine Mercy and Purity of Love through the Sacraments. We can pray this prayer not only for ourselves but for the conversion of all sinners, "O Blood and Water which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a Fount of Mercy for us, I trust in You." This prayer reminds us that we do not overcome our difficulties by our own power, but by trusting The Power of God's Infinite Love through our gifts of Faith, Hope and Love. Such loving trust brings The Holy presence of God into our lives to assist and guide us and others through our sufferings and to help us change our sinful ways into loving ways. These changes will come only through the price of Love found in the suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ. The only Son of God, which enables us to make sacrifices for others, as we offer our sufferings to The Father, just as Jesus did for us. Fr. Doug Binsfeld


