Conscience: Is it Good? or Evil?


God has given to us a conscience that speaks to our heart as a guide through the difficulties and dilemmas of life. The Catholic Church says that we must follow our conscience, but the Catholic Church also says with equal emphasis that we must form our conscience. Our conscience is going to draw from general principles that we know and believe to be good, right and just OR that which is evil,

wrong and unjust. Our conscience is formed either in God's Image and Likeness or the devil's image and likeness. This is why our Faith is so important. Faith is what God says. God's Words are eternal and unchangeable, and God makes no mistakes. Jesus tells us: "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciple, (32) and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (Jn 8:31). So if we know and accept God's Words in Scripture, then we believe by doing what God says.

If our conscious is formed well, then we will choose to follow God's Ways which is the path to Heaven through Jesus Christ in The Power of the Holy Spirit. We make a conscious and deliberate decision to obey the Ten Commandments of God and to follow all that God says. We do not add to God's Words, nor do we take anything away from God's Words so as not to alter what God says by taking His Words out of the intended context by wrongly applying them in another context. It is then that we stand strong in our Faith, and reject all immoral/evil behavior as God has instructed us about what is good and what is evil.

If we have a malformed conscience, then we alter God's Words by making an informed and deliberate decision to destroy God's Words by disobeying God's Commandments. Remember, how Jesus speaks of the seeds of Faith on the path that are taken away by birds, or the wheat that does not have deep enough soil or is choked by weeds in Mt 13:18-22. All of these refer to immoral/evil behavior that destroys God's Words within us or within others and our hearts become hardened by loving evil rather than loving the goodness of God.

However, Jesus always extends the olive branch to His enemies and persecutors as we saw at His Crucifixion when Jesus said: "Father, forgiven them, they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34), and then Jesus forgave the repentant thief who asked for mercy, by saying 'today you will be with me in paradise" (Lk 23:40-43). If we will acknowledge the evil that we have said or done, or the good we failed to do, and have sorrow for it by having the desire not to do it again, Jesus will be there for us, and Jesus will forgive us. Jesus tells us: "Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be open to you." (Mt 7:7) But we must ask Jesus, we must seek Jesus and we must knock at The Door of His Divine Heart of Infinite Love and Mercy. Satan does NOT want you to know or believe God's Words, because satan is a liar and murderer that condemns you, NOT Jesus. Jesus has come to save you. Our Lord tells us in the Gospel of John 15:1-8 that Jesus is The Vine and we are the branches. Even if we have chosen to break ourselves off from Jesus by doing evil, there is still great Hope for those who repent and believe. Jesus speaks to us through His apostle Paul in the letter to the Romans: "That is so. They were broken off because of unbelief, but you are there because of faith. So do not become haughty, but stand in awe. (21) For if God did not spare the natural branches, [perhaps] he will not spare you either.(((Jesus warned Paul not to become prideful, and reminded Paul of the Mercy shown to him when he repented of doing the evil of persecuting Jesus, Who is in the Christian people, and so Paul is warning us.))) (22) See, then, the kindness and severity of God: severity toward those who fell, but God's kindness to you, provided you remain in his kindness; otherwise you too will be cut off. (23) And they also, if they do not remain in unbelief, will be grafted in, for God is able to graft them in again. (Romans 11:20-23) This is what we have in The Sacrament of Confession, if we can do what Jesus tells us: "Repent and believe in the Gospel." (Mk 1:15) Jesus gives us His Divine Mercy through His Church as He gave His Divine Authority as God to His apostles so that they would forgive the sins of people: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." (Jn 20:23) Trust in God's Mercy; Trust in God's Infinite Love for you. God's Love is
