Jesus Thirsts for our Salvation;

^{Pastor} "(#1032) During Holy Mass, I saw the Lord Jesus nailed upon the cross amidst great torments. A soft moan issued from His Heart. After some time, He said, I thirst, I thirst for the salvation of souls. Help Me, My daughter, to save souls. Join your sufferings to My Passion and offer them to the heavenly Father for sinners."

"(#1033) When I see that the burden is beyond my strength, I do not consider or analyze it or probe into it, but I run like a child to the Heart of Jesus and say only one word to Him: "You can do all things." And then I keep silent, because I know that Jesus Himself will intervene in the matter, and as for me, instead of tormenting myself, I use that time to love Him." (Divine Mercy, page #392)

In these two paragraphs, Jesus reveals His deep and profound love for every human being, and we see St. Faustina's deep Faith, Hope and Love as she trusts in our Lord Jesus. In the first paragraph, St. Faustina is at The Holy Sacrifice of The Mass, where she has a vision of Jesus crucified and alive on the Cross suffering for each of us. She hears the soft moan in Jesus' Heart, not from His lips. St. Faustina hears the pain and suffering of The Heart of Jesus, as our Lord Loves us so intensely, that He is willing to suffer that way for each of us. Jesus suffers to save us from evil by offering His Love to anyone who believe in Him and ask for His Love. Jesus suffers as He waits for our conversion from evil to Holiness of Life, that is what salvation is. Salvation is when we make the choice not to excuse our evil thoughts, words and actions, but to stop doing them by The Grace of God.

When we make the choice to stop doing evil, it is then that we listen to what Jesus Says and begin doing what Jesus did by the Grace of God. That is why Jesus makes the following request: **"Help Me, My daughter, to save souls. Join your sufferings to My Passion and offer them to the heavenly Father for sinners."** All suffering is meant to pierce our human pride and arrogance that blinds and deafens us to The Words of Jesus. Suffering is for our Salvation, and we can use our Faith, Hope and Love to unite ourselves more closely to The Son of God by accepting the sufferings that come to us in our lives while remaining in virtue, not in vice. We choose to remain in love, not anger by forgiving others. We choose to Trust in Jesus while temptations come upon us while we suffer in this life.

We see St. Faustina practicing Faith, Hope and Love as she faced the burdens that were beyond her ability to solve. She does not frustrate her mind by trying to figure out why suffering is happening to her, she simply runs to Jesus in Faith, Hope and Love. She does **NOT** allow herself to become tormented by anxiety, frustration and anger. She simply puts her trust in Jesus, as a little child trusts in the love of his or her parents to care for them. St. Faustina turns to Jesus in Faith, Hope and Love asking Jesus to take care of the problem, and she refuses to worry. That is how Faith is supposed to work, it creates a confident trust in Jesus.

St. Faustina remembered The Words Jesus spoke during her vision of The Divine Mercy Image, as she was to put the words, 'Jesus I Trust in You', on the picture. We too need to remember Jesus' Words in Scripture as we face difficulties and hardship. "Thus Faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ." (Rom 10:17) But we must practice remembering and doing what Jesus says. The practice of Faith, Hope and Love enable us to Trust in Jesus throughout the difficulties and hardships of life. The more hardships we faithfully endure, the more we become The Image and Likeness of God. This is how we become a New Creation by God's Good Work continuing in our souls, until all evil desire is driven out of our souls and we become Holy as God is Holy. "So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. (18) And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, (19) namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." (2 Cor 5:17-19) -*Jr. Doug*
