"If I were the devil,"

"If I were the Prince of Darkness, I'd want to engulf the whole world in darkness, and I would have a third of its real estate and four-fifths of its population, but I wouldn't be happy until I had seized the ripest apple on the tree, thee.

So I'd set about however necessary to take over the United States. I'd subvert the churches first. I'd begin with a campaign of whispers. With the wisdom of a serpent, I would whisper to you as I whispered to Eve: 'Do as you please.' To the young, I would whisper that the Bible is a myth. I would convince them that man created God instead of the other way around. I would confide that what is bad is good, and what is good is 'square.' And the old, I would teach to pray after me: 'Our Father, which art in Washington.'

And then, I'd get organized. I'd educate authors in how to make lurid literature exciting so that anything else would appear dull and uninteresting. I'd threaten TV with dirtier movies and vice versa. I'd peddle narcotics to whom I could. I'd sell alcohol to ladies and gentlemen of distinction. I'd tranquilize the rest with pills.

If I were the devil, I'd soon have families at war with themselves, churches at war with themselves, and nations at war with themselves, until each in its turn was consumed. And with promises of higher ratings, I'd have mesmerizing media fanning the flames.

If I were the devil, I would encourage schools to refine young intellects but neglect to discipline emotions - just let those run wild. Until before you knew it, you'd have to have drug-sniffing dogs and metal detectors at every schoolhouse door. Within a decade, I'd have prisons overflowing. I'd have judges promoting pornography. Soon I could evict God from the courthouse, and then from the schoolhouse, and then from the houses of Congress. And in His own churches, I would substitute psychology for religion and deify science. I would lure priests and pastors into misusing boys and girls and church money.

If I were the devil, I'd make the symbol of Easter an egg and the symbol of Christmas a bottle. If I were the devil, I would take from those who have and I would give

to those who wanted, until I had killed the incentive of the ambitious. And what will you bet I couldn't get whole states to promote gambling as the way to get rich. I would caution against extremes in hard work, in patriotism, in moral conduct. I would convince the young that marriage is old-fashioned, that swinging is more fun, that what you see on TV is the way to be, and thus I could undress you in public, and I could lure you into bed with diseases for which there is no cure.

In other words, if I were the devil, I'd just keep right on doing what he's doing." (Paul Harvey 1908-2009.)

Paul Harvey expressed these distractions of evil that have enticed our nation. All of them are particular acts of rebellion that reject God for one reason or another. The Church is the mystical body of Jesus Christ upon earth, which is being attacked by many atheists and agnostics in our society today through many criticisms, some of which, are just and deserved, others are unjust and dishonest. The Bible is The Word of God that introduces us to God and His Ways of Love. People in the media have attacked and continue to attack the Bible in order to discredit it through movies. T.V. sitcoms, news, books and magazines to create doubt in the minds of people. Doubting the Word of God destroys our belief in God. God says that we can get to Heaven, if we will repent and believe. But if we do not believe in God, then we will not know the things that God says are evil and sinful, and we will not have enough awareness of the deadly dangers of particular words and actions to repent of these evils. It is then, that satan has gained his greatest victory, which is the death of Faith in the human soul through unbelief. In our unbelief, we accept the lies of evil that keep us locked in our selves and defiant against God. We remain motivated by pride, avarice, lust, gluttony, anger, envy and sloth as we pursue and acquire the comforts and pleasures that we love in this world. These other loves keep us separated from God and jealous of others as we seek to be noticed by others and gain their honor and respect. 


