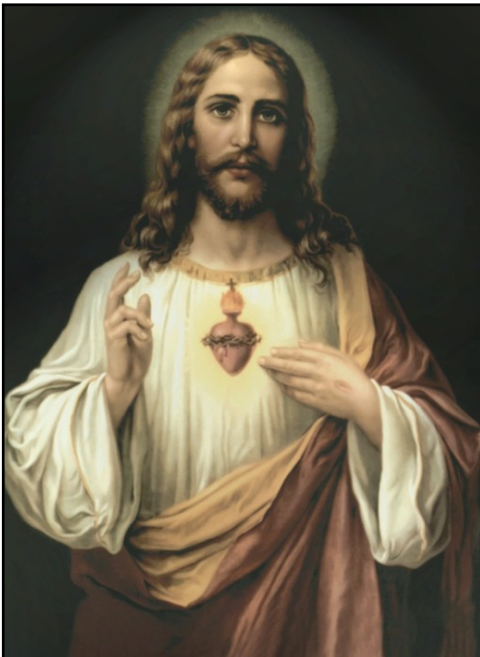

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS



The devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a private revelation given to St. Margarett Alocaque from God. It is another way that our Good Lord is attempting to reveal His Divine Love that He has for each of us through this image and devotion. On Valentine's Day, we use the symbol of the heart to say, "I love you with all my heart," and this is what Jesus is doing, as He is trying to give us a visual image of His Love that He has for each of us. Jesus opened up His Divine Life of Love and offers it to us by becoming a human being, suffering to give us The Sacraments and then dying for our sins. Our Lord's Sacred Heart has all of His Divine Love that is opened and offered to us at each Mass in The Sacrament of Holy Communion, where we receive His precious Body that is offered to us along with His precious Blood that was He shed for us from the Cross in order to sustain our souls with Divine Nourishment.



We also receive Jesus' Precious Blood through the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a different form of Grace and Blessing in The Sacrament Reconciliation. When Jesus allowed His Sacred Heart to be pierced by the lance of a soldier, it also pierced the deepest part of God's Infinite Love which is poured out to us. The Blood and Water that flowed out from Jesus' wounded Heart was fully united with God's Divine Love. The Water is united with The Graces of Purity to restore the purity of our hearts, and The Blood is The Grace of Divine Mercy that is extended to all who have sorrow for their sins and go to The Sacrament of Confession. This is The Blood of The Lamb that takes away the sins of the world because Divine Love is fully united to Jesus' human Blood.

Jesus, as God, was thinking of every human being from The Cross as He suffered and died Loving us to the end, and so the repentant sinner can be fully reconciled with God The Father in the Sacrament of Confession through The Blood of The Lamb. Remember, on the day of The Crucifixion, when the people cried out to Pontius Pilot saying, 'Let His Blood be upon us and our children,' (Mt 27:25) they were speaking out of the ignorance of hate, and without knowing what they were saying, their words reveal that everyone's Salvation depends upon The Blood of The Lamb, which is united with Divine Love and Mercy.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus reminds us of God's Infinite Love and what He has done to reveal His Love to us, as Jesus became a man, suffered to teach us and to show us a New Way to Love as He laid down His Life in Love with us. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you." (Jn 15:13-14) Remember! Jesus does only what The Father does, and God The Father Loves you with all of His Infinite Love.

This meeting is mandatory for all students who will be confirmed this spring and their parents.

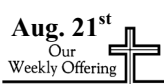

A 21 year-old Florida man once faced a misdemeanor charge that could see him pay a \$500 fine and face six months in jail. He was arrested by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission after being alerted to pictures on Facebook, showing him hugging a baby manatee.

He, who was released from Jail on \$2,500 bond, told a local television station that he meant no harm and did not know it was illegal to touch a manatee. Prosecutors allege that his actions could have induced severe stress in the young calf.

No humane or decent person wants any harm to befall an innocent baby manatee. But what about the innocent human babies who are slaughtered in the thousands each and every day in America. According to the Gutmacher Institute, about 97,500 unborn babies lose their lives each year in Florida. Where is their protection? What about their stress?
