O what wondrous things God does. A virgin is with child. Not just any child, but "The God Child, The Son of God, The Creator of the World." The All Powerful and All Mighty God comes to us in weakness and poverty depending upon His human parents to provide and care for Him. In this weakness, we see God's humble approach to us, as He is looking for our love to provide and care for Him in and through family life.

Today, we are becoming more and more educated about this existence that God created. One of the dangers of becoming so highly educated is that we can begin to think ourselves wise and that we must have scientific proof to believe anything. Such a limited view of creation is called material atheism, it is when people believe that only physical material is in existence, and there is no such thing as spiritual realities. It is good for us to question things that are in existence in order to establish the truth and validity of a thing, but we must not set up such limited perimeters so as to exclude the unseen spiritual realities. The apostle Paul tells us to test the spirits to make sure that they are good and of God rather than evil and of the devil. When we have too great of a need for tangible evidence, it can lead us to become skeptical of the unseen spiritual things that require Faith to believe; such as The Glory of God, Angels, Heaven, Purgatory, or hell. People can have experiences of these spiritual realities in this present age through a Faith experience. One day, all people will experience such spiritual realities of higher or lower realms of existence regardless of whether or not they chose to believe or deny God's Existence. God became a man in order to teach us about such spiritual realities.

With regards to the New Testament, God sent His angels to announce the wondrous news of the virgin birth to Mary, Joseph and the shepherds. It is to people of Faith that God reveals such good news. The angel Gabriel announced this spiritual truth to Mary, and Mary accepted this truth and God became a physical reality within her womb through her Faith, Hope and Love. Then an angel announced to Joseph in a dream about this spiritual truth of God becoming man in the Virgin Mary (Mt 1:20-24). Joseph accepted this spiritual reality and welcomed Mary into his home as his wife. Then at the birth of Christ, an angel appears with a radiant Glory of God showing forth, and this angel announces to the simple but faithful shepherds this spiritual truth that "a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord." (Lk 2:11). This Jesus is both Messiah/Savior and Lord has become a man and is born today. The shepherds accepted this spiritual Truth from the angel, and suddenly a great multitude of angels appeared singing Glory to God in The Highest, as God is The Greatest and Highest of all reality because God is Existence itself, and we are created into the reality of God's Existence. The shepherds went off to see The Wonder of God becoming a Man wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger. God's Peace comes to all people of 'good will,' who are people seeking Truth and striving to know and to live God's Divine Will. St. Anthony the Abbot exhorts us to live as wise men of Faith, Hope and Love, who know and accept God's Ways of Love and give witness to God by loving as God loves, so that we do not die as dumb animals never



knowing God, never knowing True Love or The Peace that the world does not give. St. Anthony put it in these words: "Man, created to be a witness and grateful interpreter of His works, is what men should strive for lest they die as dumb animals, without having seen or understood God and His works. When you lie down on your bed, remember with thanksgiving, the blessings and poverty of God." (St. Anthony the Great)
